Exciting News from the Finance and Property Committee

Our building is now 25 years old. With old age come a few expenses. We need a new roof and have come up with a long-term plan to pay for the roof, and reduce our electric bill by a significant amount. For the last six months, we have been taking estimates for replacing our roof, and examining different options for solar power on our large south facing roof. By going solar, the savings on our electric bill, combined with non-tax-based incentives, (we are a non-profit entity, and cannot take tax relief) will pay for both the solar panels and the roof within 9 years. After the roof and panels are paid off in 9 years, we will continue with energy bill savings, which will significantly reduce the money that needs to be budgeted each year to electricity costs.

We will present the full plan to the congregation at our annual May meeting. We will then ask for a congregational vote to approve the proposal to invest in a new roof and invest in the solar project.

PROJECT PIPES 620 by 2020

We are happy to announce that the contract to complete the organ by installing the Choir Division was signed on Thursday, April 18. Mr. Bill Czelusniak of the firm, Czelusniak et Dugal, drove here from Northampton MA, to meet with some members of the OCC and those responsible for signing the contract. We had time to discuss details and questions, exchange tax documents, and then proceed with signing. Work will begin soon—with the firm's technicians coming to check all the engineering specs.

The next phase will involve the organ builder working on the new wind chest for the Choir Division. We plan to keep you updated with photos and news as the project moves along.



QUILT GUILD

May meeting of the quilt guild will be on Tuesday the 21st from 1-3pm. Carol Bradford will do a tutorial on a zipper pouch. Materials needed will be:

- 1 zipper (nylon) 12" or longer
- 2 lining rectangles 11" x 9"
- 2 batting rectangles 11" x 9"
- 1 feature fabric 10" x 6" OR 10 -12 strips 2 1/2" x 6"
- 2 strips 2 1/2" x 10" of contrasting fabric
- 1 strip 1 1/2" x 5" to coordinate with zipper
- 1 strip 7/8" x 6" for zipper pull (optional)

There will be machines set up for you to use.

Mass Memories Road Show

On May 18th from 10 to 3 Brockton citizens, businesses, and nonprofits will be able to share their story at the "Mass Memories Road Show". A trained team of historians and archivists from UMass Boston will be on hand at the Main Library. Brocktonians are asked to bring in photos or mementos that tell their personal experiences of Brockton. The items, along with explanatory narratives, will be digitized. 1 year, or 100 years, from now, the story of Brockton will be online, available for future generations, and told in our own voices.

Will you help us spread the word to your constituents to come and tell their stories? And, most importantly, will YOU come and tell the story of YOUR institution's legacy and work in our community?

Folks will be able to come in any time between 10 and 3, share their information, have their item scanned, and get it back on the spot. They will be the historian of their own story – and no worries about leaving a treasured item, whether a photograph or keepsake, behind.

To date, the project has digitized more than 11,000 photographs and stories from across the state, creating an educational resource of primary sources for future generations.
