# CHRISTIAN EDUCATION YOUTH NEWS

## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSONS FOR OCTOBER – INCLUDING AT HOME DISCUSSION TOPICS:

Each month or season this year we will take one of Jesus' major themes to study in Sunday School and in church. For October, the memory verse is:

**Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven. Luke 6:37**

This month we will be focusing on forgiveness. Did you know that forgiveness is mentioned in the New Testament more often than in any other way of religion?

**October 7<sup>th</sup>:** Will be World Communion Sunday, so we will look at how other Christian and non-Christian churches forgive. Conversation for home: if we practiced a week of seeking forgiveness as the Jewish faith does, would that be easy or hard to do? Why?

**October 14<sup>th</sup>:** Bible Sunday (bibles presented to our second graders). Conversation for home: what is wonderful about having a Bible? What are some of your favorite verses? Google "forgiveness in the New Testament" and talk about some of the verses that come up.

**October 21<sup>th</sup>:** The Art of Apologizing. Conversation for home: how do we say we're sorry?

**October 28<sup>th</sup>:** The Art of Forgiving. Conversation for home: how do we forgive?



**CONFIRMATION**, a program for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders, will begin with a family orientation, dinner and worship on Sunday, October 7<sup>th</sup> at 5pm. The meetings will generally be the first and third Sundays after church, including lunch. If you haven't received the schedule, please contact the church office.

**VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED** for Sunday School. Maybe it has been a long time since you taught Sunday School and you're feeling that "I could do it one more time" feeling. Consider taking one of the month's themes and leading a class. Maybe you have a passion for inclusion and welcome and hope our children will understand its importance. Maybe you wonder about forgiveness. Maybe you are all about caring. Consider adding to that conversation by teaching for a month. There will be a shepherd with each age group – someone who has made a longer term commitment to connect with the kids (but not have to prepare the lesson). Lesson plans include supply lists, the flow of the lesson for the day, an opening exercise, questions for discussion, a project/drama/activity, and closing prayer. Contact Rev. 

## YES ON THREE


