October is a fabulous month in the church – World Communion Sunday starts us off, followed by the blessing of the animals after church on October 13<sup>th</sup>, our 10th anniversary of Open and Affirming on the 20<sup>th</sup> (with a re-covenanting ceremonial signing of the ONA statement), and Trunk or Treat Halloween Celebration (children come in costume for costume parade!!) on October 27<sup>th</sup>. The scriptures are about



things like gratitude and wrestling with God – some of the great passages – and the hymn list – well, it is strictly RP's top 55 from now through January 5<sup>th</sup>.

Of all the important Sundays we have this month, perhaps the most important DAY is Saturday, October 19<sup>th</sup>. # **Notes from Murray**

A REHEARSAL IN THE LIFF

Fall has fallen! What a glorious season this is! Such beautiful sounds and colors; just like our church. The choir is in full swing and having a great time on Wednesday nights preparing for the worship service on Sunday. A typical rehearsal begins at 6:45 with a 10 minute warmup including scales, making funny faces and other such movements to get the body and mind moving. We then, move to our songs for the coming Sunday and spend about 20 to 30 minutes refining them for worship. The next step is making our way through the next few week's music. Sometimes we sing an additional 6-8 songs during a

Wednesday night rehearsal. This gives each song at least 3 weeks of germination before it goes to the "Big Show" on Sunday morning. In the span of rehearsal we spend about 10-15 minutes per song, getting reacquainted with an 'old friend' of an anthem or learning a new one. Time is spent with gentle reminders of rhythms and certain notes that might be tricky, how to pronounce the words in a more choral way in order to make sure the blending of voices is at its optimum. The beginning of the year, we go over such things as how to process during our opening hymn. Might seem easy, but you would be surprised! It is a quick process to get practiced up on it, though! So, that is it. Everyone can sing! If you have a desire to sing, but the time wasn't right, give us a try. No obligation!!! No ability to read music is necessary. The choir works hard learning the music, but we also have a good bit of laughter and fellowship. If you're looking for a friend at church, you just might find one in choir or, if singing isn't your bag, we have bells groups, an orchestra, and youth ensembles.

A reminder that the Organ Completion Committee will be putting on another amazing movie event! The Hunchback of Notre Dame, with live organ soundtrack played by the amazing Peter Krasinski. This is an event you don't want to miss!






# New Members Class



#### A Note from the Moderator...

As you are most likely aware, there is a lot going on at Christ Congregational Church these days. You hear announcements, receive emails, read Courier articles, and listen to others talk about out-of-the-ordinary endeavors such as the Pastoral Transition Team, the Pastoral Search Committee (not the same), focus group meetings, an all-church retreat on October 19, our church profile, the anniversary celebration of our becoming an Open and Affirming congregation, and something called "Super Saturday." Meanwhile we continue to contribute to the important activities that have become ordinary sounding to us (though they are anything but): Rally Sunday, the Harvest Fair, the Stewardship Team, the budgeting process, deacon ordinations, organ concerts and organ completion. On one hand, these are signs of a vibrant, engaged church, and for that we are grateful. On the other hand, it all may be a little confusing sometimes or at least a challenge to keep all that information straight.

I believe that one quality of a healthy church is a minimal separation between those "in-the-know" and those "outside-of-the-know." Our Church Council and our boards and committees want to do what we can to avoid any such separation by nurturing good two-way communication with all church members and with others who are actively participating in our congregational life. So, we invite you to both ask questions as well as to offer your ideas related to the various aspects of our community's life and mission. To help facilitate such interchanges, we will make available a list of all Council, board, and committee chairs and members on the information counter. You are welcome to contact us. Furthermore, if you are interested, please feel free to request a copy of the Council minutes. Our new clerk, Kim Cords produces such a clear narrative of our meetings that you will actually be able to understand to a significant degree what actually happened. (<u>barrygshelley@gmail.com</u>). Finally, our upcoming transitional visioning process that includes focus groups and the all-church retreat is designed explicitly to elicit your input. (Please see the PTT report and the announcement about the October 19 meeting elsewhere in this issue of Courier.) I hope you will participate in these events as we together shape our future as a community of faith.

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
