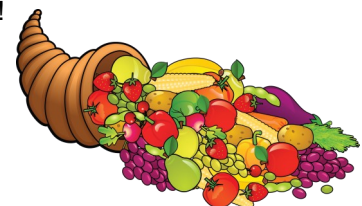

## FROM THE ORGAN COMPLETION COMMITTEE

November Midday Music on Wednesday, November 13 at 12:15 pm, featuring our own *Sylvia Berry*, with her program, "The Orpheus of Amsterdam: Music of Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck." Starting with the viola at age eleven and the piano at age thirteen, Sylvia went on to study at the New England Conservatory, Oberlin Conservatory, and the Royal Conservatory in The Hague in the Netherlands. The 'Orpheus of Amsterdam' was the nickname lovingly given to **Sweelinck** (1562–1621), an organist, composer, and music teacher whose fame reached far beyond the Dutch borders. As a child, Jan likely had his first musical instruction from his father, who served as organist at Oude Kerk—the most important church in Amsterdam at the time.

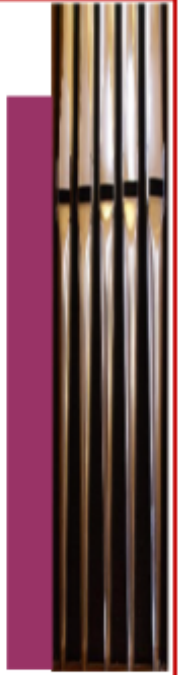

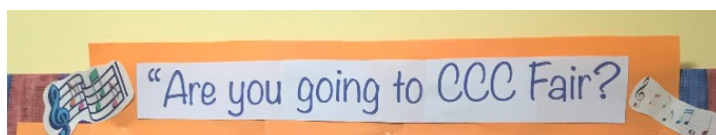
## COMMON THREADS QUILT GUILD

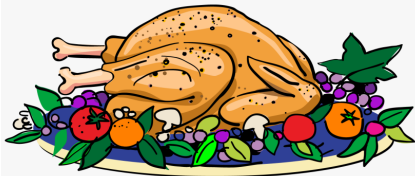

**Transition Team Update**

60 or so members, friends, and staff joined Rev. Susan Townsley, a consultant with the UCC Connecticut Conference on October 19<sup>th</sup> for a day of whimsy, questioning, and reflection around first steps, identifying the WHY, or purpose of our church. We enjoyed several fun and interactive activities including designing a church for others (*maybe even elephants*), meditations around belonging, becoming, and beyond, to really dig into our strengths and calling. The Transition Team shared a compilation of the responses to Focus Group questions from 13 groups that were held with various boards, members, and friends as well as, the team shared responses from Community Leader interviews. For context and reflection, the Team also shared demographic information from Brockton and the surrounding communities with a power point presentation. Rev. Susan shared statistics of how folks generally spend their leisure time, and trends regarding the importance of church and church attendance in the Northeast. We thank Rev. Susan for her leadership and guidance in working towards guiding us to a fuller and deeper understanding of our “why”, the purpose of our church and who we are being called to become especially in this season of Pastoral transition. Thank you for your participation, humor and thoughtfulness. If you weren't able to attend, I hope you will take time to hear from others. The excitement and energy are contagious!

In accordance with Article XIII , Church Meetings, Sec. 2 of the Christ Congregational Church, UCC, Brockton, MA Bylaws (amended on November 20, 2016) ; the Annual Fall **Meeting** of the membership has been called for **Sunday, November 17, 2019 (snow date: November 24, 2019)**, immediately following the 9:55AM Worship Service in the sanctuary at 1350 Pleasant Street, Brockton, MA to act on the following articles:

**Article I** To call the meeting to order.

**Article II** To hear and act on the minutes of the May 19, 2019 Church Meeting.

**Article III** To hear and act on the 2020 Budget as recommended by the church Council.

**Article IV** To hear a report from and provide input to the Council regarding housing options the church could offer an incoming pastor, including (1) keeping the current parsonage; (2) selling the current parsonage and buying a new parsonage in a better location; and (3) selling the current parsonage and offering a housing allowance in lieu of a parsonage.\*

**Article V** To hear and act upon any other business that may properly come before the membership.

**Article VI** To ratify, either individually or jointly, any action taken by the membership at this meeting in accordance with Article XIII, Section 3C of the church bylaws.

**Article VII** To adjourn the Annual Church Meeting.
