Notes from Murray

The rhythm of God. The power of music. The power of rhythm. It is astonishing how much music means to us in the grand scheme of things. It is in almost all aspects of public life. There are videos you can watch of famous movie scenes with the sound track taken out and to say it is dramatically different is a vast understatement. When a medium to large event is planned, usually music is involved, even if it is background music, but usually it takes a more central role. Some find music helps them focus. I remember distinctly a car ride when Eddie (my oldest son) was very young, probably less than 1 year old. My mom was visiting and she and I decided to take a drive with Eddie so that Nancy, my wife, could get a nap and some down time. Eddie was fine for a few minutes, but something was not right and he started crying, which soon became wailing. This lasted several minutes and we couldn't pull over. We were cooing and shushing as best as we could, but it didn't work. I decided to turn on our CD player in the car and music began to play. He

calmed and soon was asleep, exhausted from his energetic crying. To this day, he finds music is soothing in many stressful situations. Some schools have started allowing students to play music during tests and other times of the day. It makes sense. So, if you are stressed or find that you are under the psychological weather in these darker days of fall and winter, try music. If you are praying, try music. It might help you to focus on the topics you set out to pray for. I know when I pray or meditate, my mind wanders a bit, but if music is around me, I have an easier time staying focused on and don't fall asleep as easily.

Our Annual Christmas Concert is almost here! December 22nd at 1:00 in our wonderful sanctuary. Tell a friend! The choir has been working very hard on some great Christmas music. The bells ensembles will ring and the youth choir will sing! For the adult choir and chancel ringers, there is a dress rehearsal on Saturday, December 21st from 10:00 to 1:00. The youth ensembles will also meet but timing will be announced as we get a bit closer. Check with your director.

The Adult Choir is going Caroling! December 14th, we will be going to Bay Pointe and Heights Crossing to sing. We are working on other destinations, too! If you have interest, we have a limited number of spots, but let me know. It is going to be great fun!

CCC HARVEST FAIR



On May 19, 2019, at the annual meeting of Christ Congregational Church, the membership voted to approve the installation of a new roof on the building, and the installation of solar panels.

The roof was installed almost immediately and looks great.

The installation of 101 solar panels on the south facing roof has been done for a couple of months now. There was also extensive work done inside the building running cables, and installing electrical panels. Then came the process of waiting for inspections from the city, and then by National Grid. The final inspection was completed on Wednesday November 13th, and National Grid installed two new meters. The new meters are needed because during the late spring and summer and early fall, the meter will actually run backwards on clear days, as we generate more electricity than we use.

On Thursday November 14th, the "switch" was flicked and we finally started generating electricity.

As reported at the annual meeting last May, this solar panel system will significantly reduce our electric bill, as well as lessening our carbon footprint.



A Note from the Moderator...

If you attended our congregational meeting on November 17, you may remember my reflections on our budget. I want to reiterate what I said then and solicit your involvement in our prioritization process over the next year.

As we have for a number of years now, we again face a budget shortfall, requiring us to spend down our endowment principle in order to make up the difference between our income and our expenses. Obviously, this is not financially sustainable for the long run.

Your church officers and all boards and committees spent significant time putting together our 2020 budget. We did not ignore our shortfall. In fact, we realized some savings in expenses and some projected increases in income. However, on balance, because of our timely decision to invest a little more in our children and youth and to use a more conservative standard for projecting investment returns, our net shortfall was similar to years past—about \$100,000.

What became readily apparent to us is that we cannot erase that shortfall by shaving a little here and a little there off what we spend. It will require some innovative revenue-generation, or some creative cost savings, or some major reductions in some aspects of our program, or most likely, a combination of all three. We felt like we should make decisions about specific reductions thoughtfully, according to our mission priorities, and with well-facilitated congregational discussion and input. Furthermore, we believe it would have been premature to make such decisions—decisions that could have long-lasting ramifications—when we are in the midst of a pastoral transition, including our on-going visioning and strategic pathways processes. We elected to base our long-term budget decisions on the results of those yet-to-be-completed processes.

So, our commitment is to plan and facilitate an intentional, disciplined, and transparent process that will help us as a congregation to make faithful and wise financial decisions. We will be counting on you to contribute to that process. We don't already have a tentative plan. It really will be genuinely open. And we don't want to focus just on cuts. We want to explore ideas for increasing revenue. For example, how could we better use our building? How can we increase pledges? We want to explore ideas for saving on expenses by becoming more cost effective. For example, how much will we save in energy bills by having installed solar? If you have ideas about either our revenue or cost-effectiveness, please let us know. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could eliminate the shortfall by creatively bringing in more income and becoming more cost effective, without having to cut programs?

If after working on those ideas to increase revenue and improve cost-effectiveness, we still have a shortfall, we will very consciously consider what our budgetary priorities should be, invest in those priorities, and let go of some aspects of our life together that we collectively deem less important. Maybe we'll decide to carry out the letting-go part gradually over, let's say, three years. Who knows, maybe we'll even decide to spend more for a limited time period on designated areas believing that in the long run that will make us more sustainable. All possibilities are on the table.

It won't be easy. However, it's necessary and could actually be exciting and renewing if we do it together and we do it fairly. Thanks.


