Lenten Mission Project

During Lent, the Sunday School will be partnering with the Board of Missions to gather school supplies for Church World Service School Kits. **School kits give children in impoverished schools, refugee camps, or other difficult settings some of the basic tools for learning.** Each kit contains the following supplies:

- ◆ One pair of blunt scissors removed from the package (rounded tip, only)
- ◆ Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf or filler paper)
- ◆ One 30-centimeter / 12" ruler
- ◆ One hand-held pencil sharpener removed from the package
- ◆ One large eraser (no pencil cap erasers)
- ◆ Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers (please remove pencils from the package)
- ◆ One box of 24 crayons (only 24)

Donations of any of the above or money (we'll go purchase the supplies for you!) are gratefully welcomed.

ORGAN COMPLETION COMMITTEE

A Project Pipes Update from our Organ Builder, Czelusniak & Dugal:

On Wednesday, February 12th, Bill Czelusniak attended Leonardo Ciampa's noontime recital at Christ Congregational Church, given as a memorial to the late Richard Hill. On the same visit, Bill spent time documenting the space and construction of the organ chamber, behind the pipe-façade in our sanctuary, to corroborate dimensions for the new windchest. Back at the shop, layout and design work for this major and essential component continues on the drafting table. Simultaneously, voicer Jon Van Houten continues his shopwork renovating and preparing pipes for our new Choir division of the organ. Currently in the voicing room is the 8' stopped wood flute rank, called Gedeckt. Jon is pictured below left, calculating critical measurements for the pipe feet.



Having been cleaned already, next in line for voicing attention is the Cromorne 8' rank – reed pipes with brass resonators producing sounds imitative of the Baroque instruments of the same name, the precursor to the modern Clarinet. This stop has a light but colorful voice which will blend well with the diminutive Principal chorus of the Choir division.

As of February 23 2020, we have received pledges and donations of approximately \$159,250 = 590 pipes!

Only 30 pipes remaining; only \$6750 needed in donations to reach our goal of \$166,000. Thank you!!!

ZIMBLESTERN ADDED TO PROJECT PIPES

The Organ Completion Committee voted on February 5 to accept the gift of a *zimblestern* from Katrina Clinton and



Jo-Ellen Fisher, and the proposal from Czelusniak & Dugal on the unit and its installation.

A zimblestern is a star-shaped set of bells that produces a "tinkling," cymbal type sound when activated.

Thank you to Katrina and Jo-Ellen for this wonderful gift and addition to the organ!

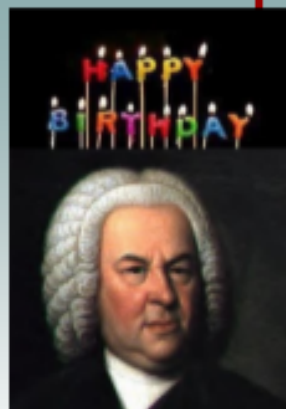

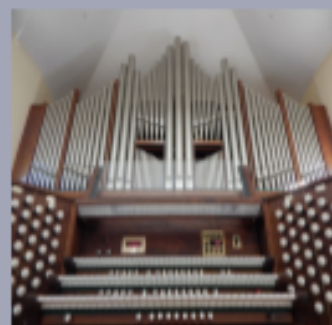

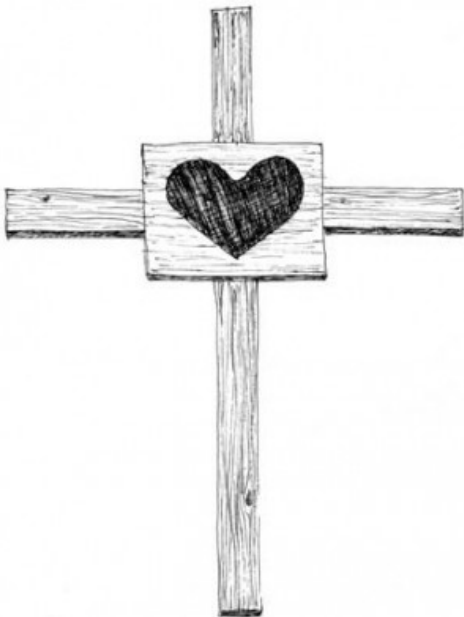

SPIRITUAL PRACTICE



Rev. Jane MacIntyre preached a couple weeks ago in February and shared about the spiritual practice of Steven Charleston, the retired Bishop of Alaska (Episcopalian) and Native American Elder. He was also the President and Dean of her seminary, The Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge.

One of his spiritual practices is to pray early in the morning and then to write a short paragraph/prayer and post it for everyone.

We may think we have very little to offer, but that is not really true. We have more love in us than we could ever possibly give away in one lifetime. We have enough compassion in our hearts to embrace the whole world, if only we could reach that far. We have a million chances to spend time with a child or with an elder, a million kind words we could say to lift up another soul. We are abundant in mercy, rich in understanding, gifted at listening which is so often all that people need for us to do. We are all more than able to support justice, bring peace, embody hope. We have so much to offer, so much to give in making this life a joy for others.

The Transition Team attended the Council Retreat last week and presented the findings from our Congregational Retreat last October, as well as from the Focus Group meetings. It was determined that as a Faith Community, our Core strengths are: a commitment to our Music Program, our Call to Love, and faithfulness to our Open and Affirming Covenant. As growth opportunities, we are united in developing strategic pathways of expanding Community Engagement, and working toward Racial Diversity and Justice.

The Interim Search Committee continues to actively discern the best possible options regarding our Interim Pastor search. In the meanwhile, we are grateful to Ann-Marie, Jane and Katrina who have graciously stepped up to fill in during this time of waiting. The Settled Pastor Search Committee has completed the Profile work, has sent it along for Conference review prior to being posted. As we move forward in the process, the PSC will use input developed from the membership, including the above Core Strengths and Strategic Pathways, as we seek the candidate most appropriate to meet the needs of our congregation. This is an exciting time!

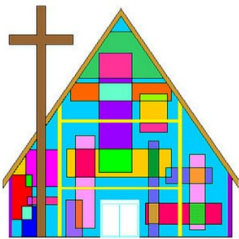

Saturday mornings, Feb. 29-April 4, 9-11am



We are looking for some folks who are willing to make 5 minute witness statements for each of the sessions. Talk to Barry, Doe or Katrina if you would like to speak to any of the following topics. We need three speakers for each session.

The theme for the series is “Transitions and Transformation” so we are talking about changes in our lives and the lessons we have learned.

Here is the schedule:

March 7th: Loss and Transformation

Can you describe a loss in your life (and this does not just have to be a death)?

Loss of eyesight or hearing or mobility, for example.

Tell how your faith and church helped or hindered you in this time.

What lessons did you learn about yourself, others, God?

March 14th: Separation and Transformation

How has a separation impacted your life?

It could be a job, a person, an organization, anyone you used to be close to.

How did your faith help or hinder your living through the separation?

What lessons did you learn about yourself, others, God?

March 21st: Renaming and Transformation

Renaming might be as simple as changing your name or as complicated as discovering a self different from what you thought you were.

What was it like to realize a new identity and to present that self to others?

How did your faith impact the change in your life?

What surprises did you find along the way? What lessons did you learn?

March 28th: Discipleship and Transformation

What difference does it make in your life that you are a Christian, a follower of Jesus?

How do you understand your own call to discipleship?

When you hear a Benediction at the end of a service, what part motivates you to go out and do some thing to help and serve others?

April 4th: Mission, Ministry and Transformation

This session will focus on how the Beloved Community of Christ Church can “Be the Church” in the future. There will be an update from the Pastoral Transition Team as well as a general discussion sharing ideas for how we can expand our ministry and serve the greater Brockton community. Let’s brainstorm together.

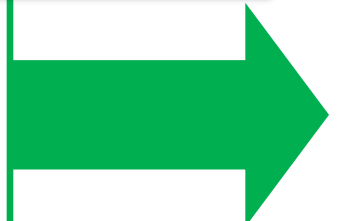
