Notes from Murray And Songs Of The Earth

As we pass over Earth Day this year in the midst of quarantine, I am reminded of many of my favorite songs of nature; its power and beauty. Do you have a favorite poem about nature? "I think that I shall never see A poem lovely as a tree" or something else?

Some lovely music has been composed to the idea of nature. We are passing from winter to spring. Here is a beautiful song about landscapes of the frozen north by a collegiate women's choir in New Zealand. Because the text is so drawn out by the

music, it is hard to understand the specific words, but imagine glaciers and polar landscapes. Another poem that takes us into spring and Easter is by E.E. Cummings - I thank You God for most this amazing day; for the leaping greenly spirits of trees and a blue true dream of sky; and for everything which is natural which is infinite which is yes (I who have died am alive again today, and this is the sun's birthday; this is the birth day of life and of love and wings: and of the gay great happening illimitably earth). I encourage you all to listen to an amazing performance of Dan Forrest's composition to the same text here. It will last a glorious 8 1/2 minutes. I love this poem and what it signifies; spring, life, resurrection, the beauty and power of nature. As we pass Earth Day, these songs can be reminders of nature's beauty in other areas besides our towns or states. Our Earth feels so small to us right now, but it is truly vast, expansive, and beautiful.

At the time I write this article, we (Sylvia, Alisa and I) are preparing a familiar anthem by Harold Friedell, "Draw Us In the Spirit's Tether." The first verse of text says: 'Draw us in the spirit's tether, for when humbly in Thy name two or three are met together, Thou art in the midst of them.' Even in the midst of social distancing and uncertainty, we can feel the presence of the Holy Spirit, God and each other. Just because we are miles away and looking at a screen doesn't mean that we are not together. Surely, it feels different in so many ways, but God is here. Are we still able to be the church? Yes. We are the church. When we come together for our Sunday services or for remote meetings, or for other social events, we are together as a community. But oh, what a day that will be when we all get together in our sanctuary!

So, what is going on inside and outside the building?



The Transition Team

The Transition Team has been busy working behind the scenes continuing to work with our Consultant, Rev. Susan Townsley on the Strategic Pathways that we might follow in the months to come, informed by our Congregational retreat and many focus groups from the fall. We were pleased to present a proposal to the Council at our February Council retreat, and are working closely with them to identify a plan to present our recommendations to the Congregation.

The Interim Search Committee has concluded the Interim Pastor search. It was recently announced that Rev. Ann-Marie Illsley has agreed to serve as our Bridge Pastor while we continue actively searching for a Settled Pastor. For questions or pastoral concerns, please contact Ann-Marie or call the church office. We are grateful and delighted to have Ann-Marie's competent and compassionate leadership during these trying times.

The Settled Pastor Search Committee is forging ahead with our work. Our Profile was posted in early April, and we immediately began receiving Pastoral Profiles. We are carefully reviewing each profile for suitability, keeping in mind the Core Values and Strategic Pathways endorsed by our congregation. We have begun the initial interview process as we embark on the discernment process for the settled Pastor who will best meet our needs.

A note from the Moderator......



These are strange and challenging times. While I believe our church has weathered the coronavirus crisis relatively well so far, some of our members and friends have been affected by COVID-19 and/or the isolation, anxiety, and uncertainty with which we live each day. I hope and pray for your health, your safety, and your strength.

As you probably know, our area, Brockton in particular, has been hit especially hard by COVID-19, in large part due to conditions that come with lower incomes—the need to continue to work where physical distancing is difficult; the need to take public transportation; the more crowded living spaces. I also pray for the health, safety, and strength of our neighbors in our city and surrounding towns.

As our church continues to function "remotely," it's especially difficult to maintain good communication. So, let me take advantage of this Courier space to keep you informed of a few matters of importance:

- 1. As I announced last week in a Nearly Weekly, we are blessed to have Ann-Marie Illsley as our full-time Bridge Pastor until a new settled senior pastor begins their ministry with us, whenever that may be. In many ways we're just affirming what we already have had amongst us: the strong, caring, and creative pastoral leadership Ann-Marie is providing. We're grateful that she is here and that she is willing to step in to this more demanding role in the midst of such challenging circumstances. We ask you to join the Council in committing ourselves to "being the church" by supporting Ann-Marie as our Bridge Pastor.
- 2. That support includes recognizing and monitoring potential workload challenges as Ann-Marie adds to what she was already doing as Acting Associate Pastor. In that light, some laypersons will continue to fulfill a few responsibilities that often would fall, at least in part, to our pastor. Please take note of the following:

- 3. Like you, your church leaders don't know when we'll be able to starting gathering face-to-face again. We can assure you that when that becomes a more viable option, we will weigh all factors very carefully before taking such steps, and when we think we're ready to invite people back into the church, we will take every precaution to assure we do so as safely as possible. We'll also try to provide options for those who are not yet ready to return that will allow them to continue to connect remotely. Finally, of course, we will let you know details through various channels of communication.
- 4. The Church Council and all Boards and Committees continue to meet monthly by Zoom video-conferencing to do the work of the church. For example, after a short delay due to the crisis, the Council is now following up on work done during our February retreat to address long-term budget concerns.
- 5. Usually the church would hold a congregational meeting in May. Due to the situation the Council voted to postpone that meeting until **June 14**, reasoning that a face-to-face meeting is more likely in June than in May (though that's uncertain for June as well). We hope to go ahead with a congregational meeting on June 14, even it's done remotely via computer and telephone.
- 6. One of the most important parts of that meeting's agenda will be the approval of church officers and board and committee members. If you are interested in serving in such a position, please contact members of the Nominating Committee: Doug Anderson, Judy Copley, Adam Mitchell, and Dave Wilcox.
- 7. Finally, please join us for virtual worship every Sunday morning at 9:55 and virtual fellowship hour immediately following that service. Over 100 persons have been participating in workshop and fellowship hour attendance has been averaging about 25 persons. We'd love to have you join us for either or both.
