PASTOR'S PAGE

It's hard to believe that it's already been a month since I started as your senior pastor. During that time I've learned A LOT about our church. I've met with all of the different committees and task forces of the church. I've talked with the staff and volunteers who help us to run our day to day life, and I've had the chance to meet some of you after worship and through virtual office hours. Through it all one thing is abundantly clear to me already - the people of Christ Congregational Church are committed to the work of building beloved community!



Over the past year everything we do has been made exponentially harder by COVID-19. Even simple things, like buying groceries or having coffee with a friend, have become almost impossible. The work of building Beloved Community is no different. It seems obvious that one part of building Beloved Community is inviting people in - and right now with COVID-19 that seems to be the LAST thing we're supposed to do. We have our work cut out for us, to be sure, but I've seen how determined we are to do this work. The members of the Deacons board are still working hard at maintaining connections with our home-based members. The CE board sent home Sunday school kits with families, and they're working on new ones for Advent. The missions board are still collecting hats and gloves and food for those in need. Finance and Property are still working hard at creating a budget that will help us to achieve our future goals and be good stewards of our resources. Finally, a new group called the Strategic Pathways Task Force began meeting to focus on ways for us to engage with our two strategic pathways: confronting racial injustice and working at community engagement. Friends, it may SEEM as though the church is closed due to COVID-19 but I can whole heartedly confirm that the church is as open and active as it's ever been!

In some ways this is a good analogy for what we hope to capture in the season of Advent. Some theologians will say that during this season we wrestle with the idea that God's kingdom is "already, but not yet". Just as it is with our church right now, it can sometimes seem like God's kingdom is not at work in our midst - because there are too many other negative things that obstruct our view of it - but if each of us does even a small bit for our part of the kingdom the whole picture can be far more incredible than we think.

I am hopeful for the future, but I am also glad to be in the "right now" with all of you. As we wander into the wonder of Advent, let us embrace the uncertainty by placing our hope in the signs that we can already see.

UPDATE FROM THE ORGAN BUILDER

Work continues in the shop of Czelusniak & Dugal, Organ Builders, on the installation of the Choir Division for our Austin Organ. During the past month, the windchest was mated to the windbox and secured; all pipework for the Choir division was racked and fitted to the windchest (and rackboards - one by one - pipe by pipe); the Choir expression box was fitted to the windchest, assembled, and secured; the expression shades were installed and the expression motor fitted to them and the structures.

It can be said that photography is a "captured record of light". The camera is recording a moment of how light hits the tree, the person, the field, the house, the whatever-is-in-the-frame. We light our candles of Peace, Hope, Joy and Love to mark the days of anticipation. Each candle reminds us of the true Light of the World and the fire of God that is within our souls, just waiting to be shared with others.

May this Advent bring new Light and Love, Joy and Peace into our world!

A Note from the Moderator...

As I write, with Thanksgiving only two days away, I am deeply grateful for the dedicated efforts of MANY church members who collectively have not only held us together, but actually carried us forward during these challenging months. Did you know that we have 51 persons who serve as church officers or members of standing boards and committees, all of whom have continued to meet (mostly via Zoom) in the service of our community's mission? Did you know that a number of those persons also have served on special temporary committees and task forces charged with leading the congregation through particular challenges of this past year? I want now to recognize one of those groups, one that is wrapping up the critical work they were tasked to do—by you--and who deserve extraordinary thanks from all of us. I refer to the <u>Pastoral Search Committee</u>--the folks who brought us Pastor Jeff, Dani, and Ivyn!

Because few of us have ever served on a PSC, most of have no idea how many hours this committee put into the search and call process over the past year. Let me give you some idea. They first took all the input produced from focus group meetings, interviews from Brockton area community leaders, our all-church retreat, demographic data, church historical documents, and more, and over three months drafted, consulted, re-drafted, consulted, and re-drafted a profile of our congregation to send out through U.C.C. networks to describe who we are, who we feel called to become, and what kind of pastoral leadership we sought. Then they reviewed MANY, not-brief application profiles from potential candidate and discussed each of them for potential fits. In the spring they spent many evenings interviewing candidates, often more than one evening per week, then assessing each candidate, re-interviewing the more promising candidates, and even interviewing a third or fourth time some candidates. Once they set their sights on Jeff, they organized a brief private visit to Brockton for the Kardisco family following all the pandemic safety protocols. They prayed and discerned some more and decided unanimously and enthusiastically to ask the congregation to call Rev. Jeff Kardisco as our senior pastor, and to discern with Jeff if this was a mutual call. Of course, then there was the challenge of figuring out how to organize a candidating weekend under pandemic conditions—quite uncharted territory. And do not think that once we voted on July 26 to call Jeff, their work was over. No! There were contractual matters, support for moving arrangements and a housing search, and a million other things you would never think of. Finally-well sort of "finally"--they took the lead on our welcoming Pastor Jeff, Dani, and Ivyn, and orienting Jeff. Even then, when they could have accepted our saying, "Thanks for a job well done," and disbanded they asked the Council to let them re-convene, hopefully next year, to organize a "proper" welcome banquet in the future once public health conditions would permit such a social gathering. No way was the Council going to say, "No!"

I know that is a lot of detail, but I am sure there is even more that I have left out. My point is that sometimes, when we are not familiar with what lies behind a certain accomplishment, it is worth emphasizing a few details after other details to more fully understand the gift we have been given. So, please join me in extending a virtual standing ovation of gratitude for the following sisters and brothers: **Sue Koza and Emily Swisher-Rosa, co-chairs, who deserve off-the-charts praise; Doug Anderson; Janet Eckstrom; Audrey Jones; Henok Kaptimer; Leigh-Ann Larson; Loren Stott; Lorraine Wilcox; and Brian Young-Ferguson**. Thank-you good and faithful servants!
