Dear Friends.

As I write this today marks 3 months since I have joined you as senior pastor of Christ Congregational Church. In that time much has happened and, at the same time, it feels as though much has stayed the same. On one hand our Community Engagement and Racial Justice task force (CERJ) have begun their work on discerning ways to pursue our strategic pathways, we have launched our first Anti-Racism Institute in partnership with the Brockton




Interfaith Community, our Media Tech team has asked all of our various committees to start submitting content for our social media pages, we've begun the work of improving our technology for streaming worship by purchasing a new camera and microphones to go with it, and our confirmation class of 6 students have met in person along with youth group gathering for outdoor activities. These are just a few of the highlights of things that are happening here, and all of the activity of our church reminds me that even in the midst of COVID-19 our church is not closed.

That being said, we are still taking great precautions due to COVID-19 to keep our members safe. Our worship has been pre-recorded for the past several weeks in an effort to minimize the number of people gathered in the sanctuary at one time, all of our board and committee meetings continue to be hosted on Zoom, and small groups are connecting online in various ways. We are all craving the in person, human, connection that we could always count on the church to provide. Personally I am eagerly awaiting the day that I can gather with all of you in person, shake your hands, and feel the Spirit of God in our midst. I also trust that that day will come soon as we hear news of vaccines being developed and distributed.

As we enter into the season of Lent our worship will focus on a theme of prayer. Each Sunday will focus on a different section of the Lord's Prayer, and other online activities during the week will be designed to lead you in discovering new prayer practices you may not have encountered before in the hope that they will enrich your spiritual life. As we focus on prayer I encourage you to pray for the day we can resume activities in person, but I also encourage you to pray for all those who have lost so much during this terrible pandemic. I encourage you to pray for all that's been lost - life, livelihoods, structure, and more – and I also encourage you to pray for the new things we will discover of ourselves as we begin to regather when it is safe. Much has happened, and continues to happen, in our lives together and much remains the same. However, no matter what season we find ourselves in one constant remains above all - God is present in our lives and God's love prevails over all else. I am thankful to be able to proclaim that promise with all of you in our Beloved Community, and I am filled with hope at all of the ways God is working in our lives together. Blessings and Peace,



What challenges we all have faced in 2020! What creativity and adaptability we have exhibited in the face of these COVID-19 challenges!
- * Here's the Stewardship Pledge Update as we prepare to WELCOME the New Year! These are Matt Howard's observations based on data supplied by Jen Brosky:
 - + Currently, we have received 60 pledges representing 79 people.
 - + 80% of the pledges received have been maintained or increased over last year!
 - + Of the increased pledges, the average increase is 15%!
 - + 33 pledges (based on last year's list) are pending. We realize that some of these pledgers might need reminders, and some may not be able to pledge, yet, because of unsure economic times. 

Adult Education Lenten Series 2021 Weekly Programs, Alternating Saturday & Sunday mornings, February 21st – March 27th

Our tradition continues even if we can't enjoy a sit-down breakfast together in-person this year. Please join us as we create space to explore various topics that have been emerging in our community.

This year we'll experiment by alternating between Saturdays and Sundays week to week and by trying a new format on the Saturdays. On the three Sundays we'll gather via Zoom soon after our worship service and begin as we have in the past. That is, to kick-off the program, two or three church members invited in advance will each share prepared five-to-seven-minute reflections on the week's topic. In our Saturday format, Pastor Jeff will begin by laying the groundwork for deeper conversations on that week's topic. In both formats, we'll spend the majority of each session encouraging both individual sharing and collective learning about what we believe and value, and how our faith matters in how we live and act in this world. We hope that such a process will nourish our spiritual health as individuals, enrich our sense of community in all its diversity, and deepen our corporate expression of faith and discipleship.



This is a lap quilts for the guild. These are just the tops to be completed.




This quilt is made by Kristine Blanchard for her son Michael.
