PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends.

As we begin the month of March and anticipate the coming of Spring there is much to be thankful for here in our Beloved Community. Vaccines are being distributed all across the country and, for the first time in many months, we can see light at the end of the tunnel. Here within our community our church remains socially distant, but certainly not closed.

The usual work of our boards and committees has continued. We have been encouraged by the



responses we've received to our fall pledge drive, the organ is close to being complete, and we have engaged in important work to develop our strategic pathways of pursuing racial justice and improving our community engagement. On January 25th we held our very first Anti-Racism Institute, led by Pastor Ann-Marie Illsley in partnership with Will Dickerson of the Brockton Interfaith Community. The institute ran for 4 consecutive weeks and we had 25 participants, with roughly half of the class being members of Christ Congregational Church and the other half being from various community partner organizations. We received such interest in this first offering that we hope to offer the training again, with the possibility of the Anti-Racism Institute being an ongoing collaborative ministry between our congregation and BIC. The CERJ (Community Engagement and Racial Justice) taskforce also continue with their work in focusing on our strategic pathways and how to bring our entire congregation along. For now a great place to start is for all of you to check out and follow the CERJ group on our Facebook page, where updates and educational resources will be shared. When we all take a moment to stop, and step back, it's clear that our congregation has remained as active as ever!

In the coming weeks and months the landscape will change as vaccines continue to be distributed and as the weather warms – allowing for more outdoor activities. The Phasing Forward Task Force, the group dedicated to discerning how and when we will regather, will continue to work at keeping our congregation safe – but we are also committed to finding data driven bench marks for how and when we will regather for in person activities. As Easter approaches and spring unfolds we are reminded of resurrection and renewal – and we can take comfort in knowing that these things are real promises for us and for our future. We will gather again in Beloved Community, and we will continue our work of being the best disciples we can be. Most importantly, we will do it all together.

Here is a song (click on O Happy Day above) I have thought about many times lately. We have sung it a few times in the sanctuary and this will be one of the first songs we sing when we are able to gather again to raise our voices in praise. Here are the lyrics:

This reminds me of something I read recently that talked about happiness and gratitude. It is easy to feel down now that vaccinations are so close and yet so far for so many of us. We long for contact with our family and friends and to get rid of the worry that is part of our daily lives. Some of us are struggling to feel happy. This is the case for me, lately. Many say, "Be happy! Smile! Just smile!" We all mean well when we are trying to cheer someone up and I appreciate it when people try to help. I am quite certain I have uttered these same words once or twice. Happiness is not always easy to feel or to create in ourselves. It is much easier to focus on someone else and try to help them, though. However, when we hang up the phone or are alone, it is easy to fall into a funk. It is easy to be forgetful of our blessings. Is it because we aren't grateful? No. I think it is because we lose focus on our many gifts and those things around us. I remember when I was in college, I worked at a 7/11 and had the graveyard shift from 11 to 7am. Saw many colorful characters in a rougher part of San Diego. I had to work the morning before Thanksgiving. A man came in around 6:00am and put a box of a dozen Hostess donuts and a quart of milk on the counter. I clumsily asked if he was looking forward to a nice Thanksgiving. I was 18 and not very graceful. He looked down at his groceries and said with a smile, "This is it! Yes!" I watched him leave and get into a dilapidated, old car and drive away. I don't know what he was thinking, but his smile stuck with me that whole morning. I was fortunate to be able to go to a friend's house for the day when my shift ended and spent a lovely day with her family, stuffing myself silly and napping on their couch before going back to work later that night. My grandfather had just passed away, a month prior to that day and I was down. I was not at home with my parents or my siblings and I didn't know very well the person and their family who had graciously opened their home to me. I had so much! It didn't feel like it at the time. When I read the aforementioned passage, I was down again and wondering why I was feeling so down. Am I happy? No. Why aren't I grateful for the many people in my life and my needs being met? When my mom died in December, I was overwhelmed by all of the cards that came to me from Christ Congregational Church members. Well the thing I read mentioned happiness and gratitude and which comes first. Happiness does not create gratitude, but the opposite. Gratitude creates happiness. While things are hard to handle sometimes, God will not give us things we can't handle. We can, however, choose how we react to those circumstances. It is so easy to focus on what the pandemic and other situations has taken away from us, but if we focus on what blessings we have in our lives, no matter how seemingly insignificant, it will be easier to be happy and might make us very happy, indeed! Music can help us with this task, too. Yes, I mourn every day for the fact that the beloved choirs I am fortunate enough to lead are not meeting in person and we have all but ceased singing as we knew it. I try not to let this idea overtake me. Instead, I focus on the future, when we will gather again and those amazing vibrations will begin again! Currently, we have Wednesday evenings, listening to familiar hymns and singing along to Sylvia playing so beautifully and we get to see each other, even if not in person. I choose to see the wonderful words being pronounced by the singers or those who just come to listen and see their calm faces. I choose to focus on the day when I get to work with the youth of our church again and exploring our new instruments, Boom Whackers! The kids will have such a great time and will delight in creating music while being able to whack something to make a joyful noise! What a happy day that will be! I am not saying choosing to be grateful is easy, especially going on a full year of the pandemic. But God gives us the strength to overcome, at least for long enough to help us through our dark times.

Here is another song that might help create a brighter day. It is a blast from the past.

Our tradition continues even if we can't enjoy a sit-down breakfast together in-person this year. Please join us as we create space to explore various topics that have been emerging in our community.

This year we'll experiment by alternating between Saturdays and Sundays week to week and by trying a new format on the Saturdays. On the three Sundays we'll gather via Zoom soon after our worship service and begin as we have in the past. That is, to kick-off the program, two or three church members invited in advance will each share prepared five-to-seven-minute reflections on the week's topic. In our Saturday format, Pastor Jeff will begin by laying the groundwork for deeper conversations on that week's topic. In both formats, we'll spend the majority of each session encouraging both individual sharing and collective learning about what we believe and value, and how our faith matters in how we live and act in this world. We hope that such a process will nourish our spiritual health as individuals, enrich our sense of community in all its diversity, and deepen our corporate expression of faith and discipleship.

Phase 2 CCC Financial Support for Ministries Task Force




