PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Beloved Community,

It is hard to believe that it has already been five months since I joined you as senior pastor because the time has flown by so quickly, and yet there are so many incredible things that have happened during this time. The energy of this congregation, and our passion for doing God's work, are truly special.

While we have accomplished much since I've arrived, and while I'm incredibly optimistic about the direction of our congregation, I am also deeply aware of how hard it has been to remain socially distant since the fall. Harder still is the fact that we haven't gathered for worship in our beloved sanctuary since the beginning of the pandemic. That's why I am happy to share with all of you that we are very close to resuming in person worship in our sanctuary. The Phasing Forward Task Force has found a data driven approach to decide how safe it is for us to be in person. We will be using CDC guidance for schools to assess the risk, and we will be getting our data on the percentage of positive tests in Brockton from the Massachusetts state website. As of now, using the CDC guidelines and based on the state's data, we are at the level of "low risk of transmission". That means, according to our metrics, the conditions are right for regathering for in person worship.

That being said, there are a few things that need to be put into place. When we do resume worship together in our sanctuary we'll be asking people to sign up ahead of time, to answer screening questions when they arrive, and we will have strict guidelines in place for how people move about the building. We will also be taking an opportunity to train people in how to use our sound equipment so that we can not only resume worship in person, but so that we can continue to live stream as well. All of the steps that remain to be taken will take some time to implement, but we are optimistic that as long as conditions remain "low risk" we will be able to resume in person worship in our sanctuary by the beginning of May. From there we will be following a "phased" approach to increase our numbers for Sunday mornings, which means we'll be periodically reviewing the limit on how many people will be able to worship in the sanctuary at one time.

The next several weeks will be full of anticipation as we prepare for this moment, but they will also require all of us to continue being patient with the process. Other elements of our congregational life, such as nursery care and Sunday school, are still being worked out and may not be in place until the fall. The Phasing Forward Task Force and I are committed to resuming in person worship and other activities, but we are also committed to doing so safely based on the best data we have available. Please continue to be on the lookout for details on our regathering plan and, if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to check in with me or any member of the Phasing Forward Task Force. The members on the task force are: Barry Shelley (moderator), Sue Koza (vice moderator), Leo Larson, Lisa Sparling, Jeff Illsley, Emily Swisher-Rosa, and Murray Kidd.

As we celebrate Easter, with our hearts and minds set on resurrection, we can see a new day coming – a day where we will be together in person again as a beloved community, finding our way in a post-covid world. We have much to be grateful for as a congregation, and we have much to be hopeful about as well. As we celebrate Easter may God's promise of resurrection be plain to you in all that you see and do.

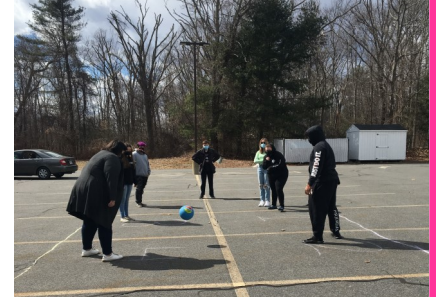


Sunday School

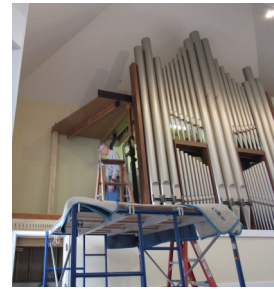

Our Austin Organ #2759 pipe organ was designed and built in 1995 to complement the acoustics of the new Christ Congregational Church building. At that time, the Choir Division was prepared for but not installed, due to insufficient funds. The organ chimes, part of the unfinished organ, were donated by Bob and Sally Cutting in 2002.

Project Pipes: 620 by 2020 set a goal of \$166,000. to complete the organ with its Choir Division, and to provide for maintenance in the coming years. We reached and surpassed the goal in June 2020.

An additional feature, the Zimblestern was donated by Rev. Katrina Clinton and Jo-Ellen Fisher.

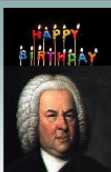

A note from the Moderator...

Despite COVID fatigue and the limits of virtual worship and meetings, we continue to work energetically at Christ Congregational Church both to hold our community of faith together as well as to move into our future with intentionality and purpose. For example, three important task forces are currently leading our thinking on (a) our strategic pathways of community engagement and racial justice, (b) what staff models might best facilitate our fulfilling our mission, and (c) how we can generate more income to support that mission. Another task force guides us as we consider how to safely return to in-person worship and other gatherings. In addition, Council is beginning to work on a Mission statement for the next 3-5 years. Meanwhile, all the other Boards and Committees continue their dedicated and creative work as we collectively strive to “Be the Church”: Deacons, Finance and Property, Christian Education, Music, Vitality, Missions, Stewardship, Endowment Trustees, Leadership Development, Organ Completion. This is not just “busy work” they’re doing. This is ministry work.

Now here’s where you come in. WE NEED YOUR TIME AND TALENTS for the road ahead. The Leadership Development Committee is currently recruiting volunteers to fill openings in church officer positions and on standing Boards. We as a congregation will vote to confirm those nominations at our upcoming annual spring meeting on May 16, and then new terms will begin July 1. Please give some prayerful thought to how you might best contribute to our beloved community and our mission outside our church walls. Where are you interested in serving?

If you are contacted by someone on the Leadership Development Committee, please seriously consider their invitation to serve in new ways or continue serving in what you’re already doing. And if you’re not contacted? Then please contact Adam Mitchell, Chair of Leadership Development (imakepix1@gmail.com) or me (barrygshelley@gmail.com) and let us know of your interests. Please don’t hesitate because you’re relatively new in our congregation and/or don’t have experience in church leadership. That’s all the more reason to get involved in some way. There are roles for every member—whether an elected position or not. We can help find a good fit—one that will be fulfilling and do-able for you given other responsibilities in your life, and that will contribute to the mission of our congregation.

Board of Deacons – responsible for the preparation of the Sacraments; the visitation of newcomers, the sick, the shut-ins, and the members of the congregation; the preparation of the Sanctuary for services of worship; overseeing the church membership rolls, and the promotion of the spiritual life among the members of the congregation.

Board of Finance and Property responsible for the financial affairs and property of the church.

Board of Missions responsible for the supervision of the Christian outreach and mission programs of the church.

Board of Christian Education responsible for the educational program of the entire church.

Board of Music – responsible for the music program of the church.

Board of Stewardship - responsible for planning and conducting the annual stewardship drive and will plan and conduct a year-round continuous education and outreach program on stewardship to the members of the church.

Board for Church Vitality - responsible for emphasizing fellowship opportunities, church growth, inclusion, greeting and welcoming newcomers to the church and promoting the mission and work of the church to the surrounding communities.

Endowment Trustees will be responsible for those trust funds or other assets transferred to them by wills, trusts, or other funds as may be directed by the membership of the church.

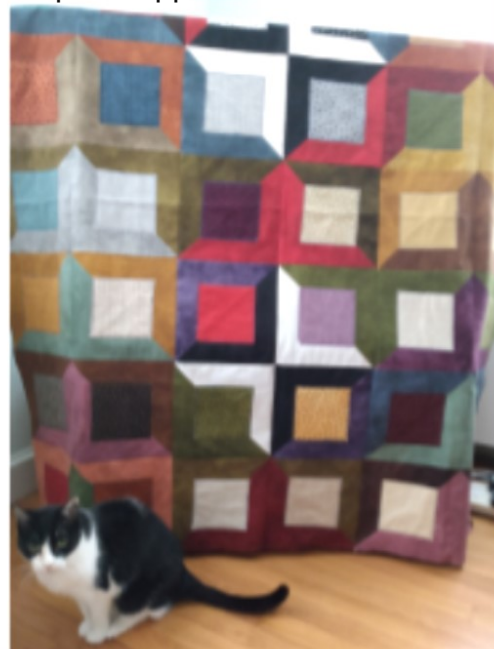
