PASTOR'S PAGE

On the evening of June 28th, 1969, police in New York City raided the Stonewall Inn at Greenwich Village forcing patrons into waiting police cars – for the sole reason that they were gay. The Stonewall riots weren't the first time that LGBTQ+ people had resisted police harassment – others at Cooper Do-Nuts in Los Angeles and at Compton's Cafeteria in San Francisco had also resisted similarly – but the riots at Stonewall are the most notable to history, and the reason people



hold Pride celebrations throughout the country during the month of June. The origins of Pride month are rooted in resistance, but celebrations of Pride have taken different shapes throughout our country – ranging from parades to town hall forums to food festivals and picnic style gatherings in open spaces. Pride month is still rooted in resistance as the struggle for equity continues – with legislation like the Equality Act languishing in the US Senate, and other harmful legislation being pushed through on the state level that would limit the rights of LGBTQ+ people – but Pride month is also, still, a celebration!

As an Open and Affirming congregation of the United Church of Christ we would like to emphatically wish a happy Pride month to everyone throughout our community! As an Open and Affirming church we publicly declare that we are allies and friends – and that we will always do our best to ensure that our beloved community is a safe place to turn. As an Open and Affirming congregation we denounce the harmful and hateful theological frameworks that fuel homophobia throughout our communities, our country, and our world. As an Open and Affirming congregation we reject the idea that equal rights for LGBTQ+ people means diminished religious liberties for others. As an Open and Affirming congregation we stand for love, not hate or rejection, because love is the basis of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As your pastor I can say that we are not always perfect at living out our covenant to be Open and Affirming – but we must always be devoted to it. During this Pride month let us celebrate with joy that there have been great strides since the time of the Stonewall riots, but let us also reflect on the ways that progress must still be made. We can't simply *say*

that we are allies – we must *be* allies, because that is what we have covenanted to do.




Children and Youth Sunday

MEDIA TECH TEAM

Media Tech is doing a lot of work for in-person services. We have been practicing in the sanctuary, streaming the Sunday services to iron out all the kinks. As we move forward to returning to full capacity, part of our new normal will include continuing to stream our services to give people an opportunity to watch when they can't be present.

Streaming may seem simple enough, just click the button and watch on YouTube right?

But there is a bit of effort that does go into it.

For instance, a typical in-person service will include the following:

- A video camera to capture video, and a camera operator
- Pre-recorded songs to be streamed at specific times during the service. These are recorded by our • musicians and enhanced for streaming
- Pre-recorded songs played through the sanctuary's sound system
- A central computer with software that connects to audio and video capture devices, and pushes it out to YouTube to stream

Currently, we have 3 positions to fill at each service who do one of the following:

- 1. Operate the video camera
- 2. Run the streaming service and play the videos/music at the right time
- 3. Operate the songs for all the people in the sanctuary

LIVE STREAMING

As we move forward we will be training people in the various aspects of streaming the service with the goal of creating a rotating schedule at each service.

It may seem overwhelming and nerve-wracking, but it's not as hard as it seems. We are there to help and train others so that we can all have a satisfying experience.

(Not Snippy! Just Zippy!)

I heard a wise man, in a Church meeting about Endowments, say; "We are eating fruit from trees that we did not plant." He was speaking about our invested funds that we draw on annually to pay any shortfalls in our budget. In the same meeting, it was noted how fortunate we are as a congregation, to have our invested funds. That being said, we have been the benefactors of a strong stock market that has helped our invested funds maintain their current level of value. What if the market had been doing poorly and our return had been less? Where would we be long term? Although our current endowments carry a value of just over \$2 million dollars, we don 't have the use of all of that money, as a good percentage of it is locked into funds that target a specific aspect of the Church, and those funds can ONLY be used for that department. For example: The Deacons fund can be used only for Deacons needs; the Flower fund can only be used for flowers, the Music fund can only be used for music needs, etc. We are indeed lucky that our forebears of the Church helped us to prepare, not for their present, but for our present.

To quote from "The UCC Planned Giving Manual":

"Stewardship in the Church is often limited to meeting next year's budget by members giving out of their current income. Seldom is the holistic perspective of stewardship cited—that all we are and have been given is a trust from God, including one's accumulated assets." Stewardship, as our committee over the years has often said, is more than just pledges; it extends to all facets of the Church community, and encompasses our time and talent, as well as our treasure.

Let me introduce you to planned giving, where we build our community not only for our present, but for our Church's future. In the coming months your Stewardship committee will be working with your Endowments committee to educate ourselves, and you, on preparing our Church for the next 100 years. We will do this by hopefully bringing in speakers and experts to discuss subjects such as financial planning, wills, and what planned giving is all about. These are all topics that are important to us all on a personal level, but (at least in my case) often get put off as "something to take care of later." It is a scary thought, but "later" gets here sooner than we think, and we all should do the best we can to prepare for our "later." By planting seeds now, we can nurture them and watch them grow into the tree that will sustain us down the road.
