# FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS

The Christian Education Board has been hard at work these past months preparing for the return to in-person faith formation. This year, we'll be trying out a slightly different structure for Sunday School. Our hope is that these adjustments will continue to help our children and youth grow as disciples of Christ. You can read more about our programs for different age groups below and as always, please feel free to reach out with any questions!

#### MIDDLERS

#### 2ND - 7TH GRADE

This class will follow a non-traditional schedule that seeks to balance bible story lessons with exposure to worship and projects that put faith into action.

#### WEEK 1

Class meets in the wing during worship for a lesson with a bible story and fun activities.

#### **WEEKS 2 & 3**

Students attend worship, sitting with their families or in the Youth Prayground, Activities connected to the monthly lesson available for during worship or to take home.

#### WEEK 4

Class participates in a service project connected to the monthly lesson.

#### K/1 CLASS

#### **KINDERGARTEN - 1ST GRADE**

With a curriculum focused on bible stories and packed with fun, developmentally appropriate activities, the K/I Class is a great space for children who are beginning to learn more about God and faith. This class meets weekly, with students present in worship for part of the service.

#### NURSERY

#### **INFANTS - PRE-KINDERGARTEN**

Overseen by childcare professional, Tammy Blackler, the nursery is a safe and caring space for our youngest kiddos. Children visiting the nursery can look forward to playtime, bible stories and fun crafts and activities led by Tammy and an additional volunteers. Nursery care is available on Sunday mornings beginning at 9:30am.

#### CONFIRMATION

#### **8TH GRADE AND UP**

Confirmation is an opportunity for youth to affirm the vows made at their baptism and to become full members of the congregation. This class, led by Pastors Jeff and Ann-Marie, provides an opportunity for youth to explore and ask questions about their faith as they prepare to be confirmed.

#### MISSION PROJECT VOLUNTEER

A week in the life: Varies. These volunteers might help prepare the project through the month, assist children and youth participating in the project during worship on the fourth Sunday of the month, or accompany them into the community to complete the project.

#### **YOUTH GROUP LEADER**

Assist in planning, communicating and leading youth group meetings with Pastor Ann-Marie and other youth leaders. **Time commitment:** Approximately 4-5 hours a month. The Youth Group meets 1-2 times a month for 1.5-2 hours. Youth volunteers typically sign on for the year or half-year.

#### SUPPLY CLOSET SUPERHERO

Is organization your jam? Help keep the CE closet in working order and assist with special organization projects. **Time commitment:** Variable, a few hours a month as needed.

#### Youth Group



# STEWARDSHIP

2021-2022

It is that time again. Your Stewardship team is working on its plans for the 2022 Christ Congregational pledge drive. Our Stewardship theme for 2022 of "Rooted in Love" draws inspiration from Psalm 1: "They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season." The Psalmist invited us to imagine all the good things we can bear when well-planted. What might we give away when rooted in love? But the Psalmist also meant something deeper. The word we translate as "planted" in English means "transplanted" in Hebrew. This translation speaks to the power of love to move us from one place to another, the power to convert us from one way of life to another. What would need to change in our lives for us to be fully rooted in love?

We might need to make a move from a "mindset of scarcity" to a "mindset of abundance." A scarcity mindset makes us think there will never be enough--we must compete, one against another, because there is not enough to go around. Scarcity thinking names all the things we cannot do, all the things we cannot share. But a mindset of abundance sees the fullness of God's love. Martin Luther King Jr. saw the world abundantly--despite all the injustice he confronted, King knew God's spirit moved through history, creating and renewing community.

King once described the force of love that animated the Civil Rights Movement. "Agape is not a weak, passive love. It is love in action. Agape is love seeking to preserve and create community. It is insistence on community even when one seeks to break it. Agape is a willingness to go to any length to restore broken community."

What would it mean for our lives to be rooted in such love?
