PASTOR'S PAGE

Howard Thurman is a Black theologian and scholar who lived from 1899 to 1981. He was an American Baptist preacher and theologian, the first African American dean of chapel at Marsh Chapel of Boston University – where he mentored many young black leaders, including Martin Luther King Jr. – and he was a cofounder of *The Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples* in San Francisco (the first integrated interfaith religious congregation in the United States) in 1944. As the grandson of former slaves, he lived a life that connected



between the realities of slavery in the United States (and the lasting impact it had on families) and the advent of the personal computer – with IBM's first personal computer debuting in 1981, the year of his death. In 1953 he published a collection of written reflections titled *Meditations of the Heart*, and as we enter into Black History Month I'd like to invite all of you to receive and reflect upon one of his writings – rather than hearing from me. Throughout the month of February we will be committed to centering the voices of often overlooked African American voices, and I sincerely hope all of you will take some time this month to explore voices of Black leaders who you might not have previously heard from. The following excerpt from Howard Thurman's book, *Meditations of the Heart* is titled, "God is Present"

God is present with me this day.

God is present with me in the midst of my anxieties. I affirm in my own heart and mind the reality of His presence. He makes immediately available to me the strength of His goodness, the reassurance of His wisdom and the heartiness of His courage. My anxieties are real; they are the result of a wide variety of experiences, some of which I understand, some of which I do not understand. One thing I know concerning my anxieties; they are real to me. Sometimes they seem more real than the presence of God. When this happens, they dominate my mood and possess my thoughts. The presence of God does not always deliver me from anxiety but it always delivers me from anxieties. Little by little, I am beginning to understand that deliverance from anxiety means fundamental growth in spiritual character and awareness. It becomes a quality of being, emerging from deep within, giving to all the dimensions of experience a vast immunity against being anxious. A ground of calm underlies experiences whatever may be the tempestuous character of events. This calm is the manifestation in life of the active, dynamic, Presence of God.

*God is present with me this day.*¹

Sponsored by Magnificat Liturgical Artwork, the program is free, with donations accepted for the "Negro Spiritual Royalties Project – Brockton"

What is the "Negro Spiritual Royalties Project-Brockton?"

Modelled after a project begun at the United Parish in Brookline, MA, it seeks to address the reality that many African American composers never earned royalties for the music they created, and that the "Negro Spirituals" that have enriched worship and justice movements over the years were folks songs created by enslaved Africans, authors unknown. When this music is used in events under the Arts & Music program, the Board of Music will select a local music education program to whom to forward any donations. For February, donations will go to the Rose Conservatory.

Why did Stewardship and Endowment Trustees create a Christ Church's Planned Giving Program?

Here are some of the education goals...

- Normalize talking about money and faith since Jesus and the bible talked about money a lot. For example, money is mentioned 140 times in the King James Version of the bible or 11 out of the 39 Jesus's parables are about money.
- Normalize talking about planning for after your death both in money and funeral arrangements.
- Teach about making good financial decisions for now and the future so we can be good stewards for God.

Here is how we plan to do it...

- The month of May is a focus on "Planned Giving"! During the services, we will have witnesses and education of planned giving by our members.
- Also, on a Saturday in May, offer a full day workshop on a topic that will assist people with finances and planned giving matters.
- Offer a two-hour workshop in September or October to teach more financial education and stewardship.
- Offer helpful planned giving and money management articles in the courier every month.
