PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends.

I love the season of Lent. I love the waiting. I love the soul searching. I love the gravity of the journey – knowing that it leads directly to Jerusalem and to the cross. I love that it means something deep and profound. I love that it reminds me I'm part of something MUCH bigger than myself, or even my congregation. I love the season of Lent for so many reasons – but what I love most about Lent is the way it's meant to remind us that we're on the journey together. That all of us



are imperfect, and have probably all been broken at some point and (hopefully) put back together – even if that means we've been changed. While we observed Lent *together* last year, I am incredibly excited to observe Lent with all of you *in person*.

We will have three special services as part of our Lenten season – Ash Wednesday (on March 2nd), Maundy Thursday (on April 14th), and Good Friday (on April 15th). We found meaningful ways to observe these days last year, all while keeping our suspension of in person worship and activities in place – but this year our plan is to have each of those services *IN PERSON* as well as online. Whichever way you choose to participate – whether online or in person – I sincerely hope you'll join us for one or all of these services.

For our Sunday worship services I'm honored to share with you what our very first worship planning team has come up with. Using their own creativity, and some resources to help set a theme, a group of your peers have planned every Sunday of the Lenten season. I'd like to especially thank Doug Anderson, Jane MacIntyre, and Adam Mitchell for giving of their time and for graciously sharing their creative insights to our worship planning process. Some things will be different from what we've grown used to, but the worship planning team has been incredibly intentional about every move they've made. I'm excited to see what conversations come up from all of it. Also, please keep in mind that we will have worship planning teams again starting in the fall – so whether or not you love what this team has done in planning worship, I invite you to be on the lookout for a sign up to the *next* worship planning team – and to sign up to participate. As we continue to grow in this practice of having regular worship planning teams we will continue to grow in our connection through this Beloved Community.

I'm grateful to be in Beloved Community with all of you, and I'm grateful for the way that God has continued to move in our midst. This season will reveal God to us in so many ways that we can't even imagine yet – and I'm excited to see where God takes us.



NOTES FROM MURRAY

As we head into Lent, you might have noticed over the years that some noticeable things happen in the music during worship. There are certain words missing. You won't hear Alleluia (Hallelujah) or Gloria in our hymns and anthems. The church has returned to a time in the liturgy when we focus on the journey of the people of God who were in exile, waiting for the arrival of the Messiah. It is also a time when converts learn about the faith and prepare for becoming a member of the church.

Also, during Lent, we turn our focus toward the salvation of humankind through Christ's death and resurrection. In order to emphasize the

penitential nature of that journey, many denominations remove the Alleluia (and Gloria) from the service. We no longer sing with the choirs of angels for forty days; instead, we acknowledge our shortcomings so that we may again have the privilege of worshiping God as the angels do. On Easter, (or the Easter Vigil on Saturday night) to celebrate Christ's resurrection and triumph over death we again sing with the angels, Alleluia and Gloria in excelsis!

The Choir is seeking more members to help us celebrate Lent, the triumphal Easter service and beyond! No experience is needed. Come and join this faithful group of musicians as we solemnly, and with great humor along the way, prepare our worship music on Wednesday evenings from 6:45 to 8:00pm in the sanctuary. On Sundays, we gather at 9:00am to warmup for the 9:55am service. This year has been very challenging for all choirs, everywhere, as we have navigated through Covid. Due to our amazing Phasing Forward Task Force, our choir has been fortunate to safely sing in the fall season through Advent and will be resuming our regular schedule this week. Many churches are still fully remote and many choirs are still not operating throughout the country. WE NEED YOU! We are very fortunate to be able to lift our voices in worship together with our congregation (singing quietly) with us. Our choir members must be fully vaccinated and boosted. Individuals in choir can sing with or without a mask. Join us as we undertake this calling to serve the church we love. We will begin rehearsing on March 2nd before the Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 (our call time is 6:00pm). It will be followed by a rehearsal to get us practiced up on music for the first Sunday in Lent. In addition to the music for Lent, we will be practicing music for Easter which means that, behind the scenes, the choir gets to sing Alleluias early. Sshhh, don't tell anyone! Come join us!

Description Of Boards

Board of Deacons - Responsible for the preparation of the Sacraments; the visitation of newcomers, the sick, the shut-ins, and the members of the congregation; the preparation of the Sanctuary for services of worship; overseeing the church membership rolls, and the promotion of the spiritual life among the members of the congregation.

Board of Finance and Property - Responsible for the financial affairs and property of the church.

Board of Missions - Responsible for the supervision of the Christian outreach and mission programs of the church.

Board of Christian Education - Responsible for planning and overseeing faith formation programs that help people of all ages grow into disciples of Christ.

Board of Music - Responsible for the music program of the church.

Board of Stewardship - Responsible for planning and conducting the annual stewardship drive and will plan and conduct a year-round continuous education and outreach program on stewardship to the members of the church.

Board of Vitality - Responsible for emphasizing fellowship opportunities, church growth, inclusion, greeting and welcoming newcomers to the church and promoting the mission and work of the church to the surrounding communities.

Endowment Trustees - Responsible for all the invested funds of the church and overseeing Rockland Trusts management of said funds. In charge of the planned giving campaign design and execution with stewardship. Steward of the individually named funds to honor donor requests and compliance of the monies being used.


The Mittens and Hats and Scarfs went to BIC (Mutual Aid) for distribution through their channels.

The past two years have been a challenge, and we know some of our members have struggled with the loss of connections between us. We will be setting up a private Facebook page called **Beloved Community Connections**, to connect those who need support with those who wish to reach out for contact. We will also be setting up some type of 'bulletin board' system where members can post specific needs or offerings, so that we can strengthen our connections and help rebuild some of the fellowship that we have lost during the pandemic. The requests can be posted without identification if desired, to protect the privacy of those in need.

Some examples of needs and offerings:

- Small sofa needed for downsizing member
- Monthly coffee/tea/conversation visits available
- Weekly ride to Sunday Worship needed
- Children's clothing sizes 4-7 available, mostly boys clothes
- Meals needed for housebound member recovering from surgery
- Member available to run local errands once a month

One less thing to do on Friday night. During the 6 Fridays of Lent, Christ Congregational Church (CCC) will be selling dinners for pick-up. Beginning Friday, March 4th through Friday, April 8th swing by the CCC church kitchen between 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. for a fully prepared, delicious meal.

Many of the planned menu items offer recipe options for vegetarians and/or gluten-free needs. Dinners will be sold as small, 2 portion size, and large, 4 portion family size. Generally dinners will be priced small \$20.00 and large \$35.00; please refer to weekly order sheets for details.

Our famous and favorite Macaroni and Cheese will be available every week.

Desserts will be offered each week; no drinks are planned.

Orders and payment must be received by noon the Wednesday (payments may be made on-line and/or by credit card) prior to the Friday night dinner.

Orders from the general public are welcome for our Pick-Up Lenten Friday Dinners. During Lent plan a stop through the CCC kitchen parking area.


