

#### Dear Beloved Community,



But God continues to remind me that PERFECTION isn't what we're called to.

God continues to remind me that being settled and content are not what we're called to. God continues to remind me that we're called to show the world Jesus' compassion, empathy, love, and grace.

Since this time last year new challenges have arisen for all of us as individuals, as a congregation, and throughout the world. We've been (as the writer of 2 Corinthians says), "confused, but not depressed. Harassed but not abandoned. Knocked down, but not knocked out," and through the compassion, empathy, love, and grace of Jesus we've endured. The writer says, "We always carry Jesus' death around in our bodies so that Jesus' life can also be seen in our bodies." With these words we're reminded that the way Jesus lived (with compassion, empathy, love, and grace) was rejected by the world, leading to his crucifixion – but even in spite of that, the joy of the gospel and the message of God's grace endured and we're invited to join in. It isn't perfect, but it's GOOD. It isn't easy, but it's WORTH WHILE. It's work that never ends, but it will gratify your very spirit.

As we continually do the work of getting back up, trying (imperfectly) to live the way Jesus taught us, the first words of this passage should bring comfort and a sense of purpose. The "awesome power" belongs to God, and doesn't come from us. While we're called to live in the way Jesus taught, we're also not responsible for saving the world on our own – so we continue the journey in Beloved Community with God in our midst. #### Scholarships at CCC





**Board of Vitality** - Responsible for emphasizing fellowship opportunities, church growth, inclusion, greeting and welcoming newcomers to the church and promoting the mission and work of the church to the surrounding communities.

**Endowment Trustees** - Responsible for all the invested funds of the church and overseeing Rockland Trusts management of said funds. In charge of the planned giving campaign design and execution with stewardship. Steward of the individually named funds to honor donor requests and compliance of the monies being used.


