PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends.

As we enter the month of May, still feeling the glow of Easter resurrection, I'd like to share with you about some work I've been doing with Deb Bowman and other members of our Stewardship and Trustees committees. For the month of May we'd like to invite you to join us in *Planned Giving Month* – a month dedicated to sharing the benefits of



planning a financial gift to the church as part of your estate plans, or by giving in other less traditional ways than a weekly envelope or electronic offering. This is part of a new shift where we will focus on stewardship in the fall, as we always have – but then we can also focus on planned giving each spring.

Most of you know why stewardship is important – because our stewardship campaign each year helps us to set our operating budget. With planned giving, the goals are longer term. Our church has invested funds that earn interest from year to year with the goal of steady, continual, growth. Our Trustees manage those funds with Rockland Trust and they are always looking for opportunities to shore up those funds as a foundation to our future. Throughout Planned Giving Month you will hear stories from others who have given, and planned to give, in this way – and the Trustees would also like to invite you to a planned giving workshop on May 21st where we will have a scripture study on some of what the Bible has to say about money, as well as workshops on questions folks might have about wills and estate planning. Be on the lookout for more details in the weeks ahead!

Being resurrection people is about keeping our eyes to the future and helping to cultivate the garden now, not necessarily so that we ourselves will benefit – but so that we might build something that lasts in sharing the good news of God's eternal love.

The deadline for submitting an application is June 1st, 2022.


Camperships are available!







Beloved Community Connections

The past two years have been a challenge, and we know some of our members have struggled with the loss of connections between us. We will be setting up a private Facebook page called **Beloved Community Connections**, to connect those who need support with those who wish to reach out for contact. We will also be setting up some type of 'bulletin board' system where members can post specific needs or offerings, so that we can strengthen our connections and help rebuild some of the fellowship that we have lost during the pandemic. The requests can be posted without identification if desired, to protect the privacy of those in need.

Some examples of needs and offerings:

- Small sofa needed for downsizing member
- Monthly coffee/tea/conversation visits available
- Weekly ride to Sunday Worship needed
- Children's clothing sizes 4-7 available, mostly boys clothes
- Meals needed for housebound member recovering from surgery
- Member available to run local errands once a month
