"He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more. There will be no mourning, crying, or pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. Then the one seated on the throne said, 'Look! I am making all things new.' He also said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.' Then he said to me, 'All is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will freely give water from the life-giving spring.'" Revelation 21:4-6



Recently the Wednesday morning bible study has undertaken a study on the whole book of Revelation. For the next several weeks they'll be going through Revelation, chapter by chapter, to try to understand the text and to reclaim some of its meaning. It's no secret that fundamentalist Christians interpret the book of Revelation in a very specific way, and that way can be scary and judgmental and divisive — and we all know that's not what Jesus' gospel is all about. As I've been thinking with the bible study about studying Revelation, and as I look at our landscape together (both right now, and in the short term) it's clear to me that we all might need a bit of Revelation thinking.

We find ourselves in a time of mixed emotions, both on a big scale and in small ways. Recently the Supreme Court effectively overturned Roe v. Wade, the supreme court decision that has protected a woman's constitutional right to choose for herself for the past 50 years. I'm sure all of us have friends on our social media timelines who are grieving, and we probably also know others who are celebrating. On July 17th we will welcome our friends from Stoughton for the first step in a long process to integrate our ministries together – and while we're overjoyed at the prospect of their joining us (and they too have expressed optimism, hope, and joy in this process) it's important to remember that they will be a collective group of folks grieving the closure of their former spiritual home. We could go through so many other scenarios, but you get the point – nothing is ever just ONE thing, but rather there's always nuance. If we're honest with ourselves, that nuance is hard.

That's why I think Revelation thinking is what we need to cling to now – because the driving message throughout the book is that God is making all things new, and that those who have felt marginalized or outcast will be invited in. What's more is that this invitation is for the whole of creation, so that peace and justice and grace can be realized for all of God's children. What's more is that we aren't alone, and God never expected us to navigate this life alone to begin with. The Alpha and the Omega is making all things new – and sometimes making new things can obscure the vision of what's coming because of the work at hand (think about all those home and yard projects that look AWFUL until they're complete) but just because the vision is hard to see doesn't diminish the need for participation in the new thing that's coming.




Bibles for the Sunday Schoolers!


For Children & Youth


