PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends,

With our friends from Stoughton getting ready to join us for worship on September 25th I wanted to use my space in this month's Courier to piggy back off of what Sue Koza shared for her moderator's article. The resource she shared articulated the grief our friends will be experiencing very clearly and concisely, please take a moment to read it if you haven't already.

I've always found that walking with people who are grieving is made somewhat easier if I have a playbook going into the experience – a framework of actual, tangible, things that I *know* I can do –



because what makes counseling grief so difficult is how unpredictable and varied the process can be, as well as our own feelings of helplessness. So, as we prepare to welcome our friends I wanted to take this opportunity to share a few concrete things that most anyone in our congregation will be able to do!

- Wear your name tag for the entire month of October! This comes directly from the folks in Stoughton as part of our steering team conversations. Name tags also take away the pressure of having to ask, and having to remember, so many names in a new place.
- 2. Help them to connect by introducing yourself and then introducing others. It can be easy to be lulled into thinking that everyone at church knows everyone else, and that everyone at church knows how things run around here, but we are a lively and diverse congregation! Extend low pressure, low commitment, invitations like getting coffee or sitting together at Fellowship Hour and use those opportunities to establish friendship first.
- 3. **Don't try to talk them out of their feelings.** It can be uncomfortable (for anyone) to walk with another in grief, and often times that leads us to avoid the discomfort by either trying to comfort someone who isn't ready to be comforted or by trying to talk them into seeing things in a more positive way. One way to show the folks from Stoughton how much we love them is to simply listen when they talk, even if they're speaking from their grief.
- 4. **It's also important to remember that grief can't be "fixed".** Grief lasts a lifetime, our relief from it comes as the pain of it dulls and we learn to live life in a new way. We won't be able to "fix" what hurts and that's OK.
- 5. **DON'T say** "I understand". There are few of us who will be able to understand what our friends are going through unless we've been through the closure of a church we attended for our whole life it's fair to say we won't even remotely begin to understand. But what should we say instead? A few phrases I find helpful as substitutes are: "I imagine that must be..." "It sounds like that experience..." "Could you tell me more about...". What these phrases all have in common is that they revert back to the other person's experience, which helps us to not put ourselves in the center of someone else's experience.
- 6. Be yourselves! Nothing is more refreshing to someone who is in grief than being supported by people keeping things "normal". The steps before this one are important, but being your authentic self to someone who is grieving establishes trust and connection – and you can't do much with these other steps without those!

I trust that everyone at Christ Congregational will lead with love as we welcome our friends from Stoughton, and I'm excited to hear all of the stories of budding friendships and connections being made upon my return from parental leave. God has blessed this congregation with a moving Spirit, and people to be moved by it.

FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS

This year, we'll be continuing our updated model of Sunday School with a few adjustments based on feedback we received from parents and youth. You can read more about our programs below and as always, please feel free to reach out with any questions!

MIDDLERS

3RD - 7TH GRADE

This class will follow a non-traditional schedule that seeks to balance bible story lessons with exposure to our worship services with spiritual practices and justice projects that put faith into action.

WEEK 1 - COMMUNION SUNDAY

The class will remain in worship this week for an intergenerational service with opportunities for participation and even worship creation.

WEEK 2 - SPIRITUAL PRACTICE

The class will begin in worship, then head to the wing to explore a spiritual practice.

WEEK 3 - JUSTICE PROJECT

The class will begin in worship, then head to the wing to participate in a justice project.

WEEK 4 - BIBLE STORY

The class will begin in worship, then head to the wing to learn about a bible story that will be featured in worship the following week. There will also be an opportunity to sign up to participate in worship the following week.

K-2 CLASS

KINDERGARTEN - 2ND GRADE

With a curriculum focused on exploring bible stories through the lens of spiritual practice and wonder, the K-2 Class is a great space for children who are beginning to learn more about God and faith. This class meets weekly, with students present in worship for part of the service.

NURSERY

INFANTS - PRE-KINDERGARTEN

Overseen by childcare professional, Tammy Blackler, the nursery is a safe and caring space for our youngest kiddos. Children visiting the nursery can look forward to playtime, bible stories and fun crafts and activities led by Tammy and an additional volunteers. Nursery care is available on Sunday mornings beginning at 9:45am.

CONFIRMATION

8TH GRADE AND UP

Confirmation is an opportunity for youth to affirm the vows made at their baptism and to become full members of the congregation. This class, led by Pastors Jeff and Ann-Marie, provides an opportunity for youth to explore and ask questions about their faith as they prepare to be confirmed.



We can reach out and offer our sisters and brothers a safe and healthy place to share their emotions, a place to cry- and to laugh; a place of patience and reassurance as we work together to establish new relationships and routines. The legacy of Stoughton First Congregational church will be woven into our rich history, and our vital work of sharing Christ's missions of faith, fellowship and justice will persist, strengthened by love.
