PASTOR'S PAGE

One of my most vivid memories of being a young member of a church is my first council meeting. I was probably 15, and we went to the meeting as part of our confirmation class. Pastor Jim, our pastor and teacher, had encouraged us all to think of ideas we might like to present to council for their consideration – and I learned a lesson that day that I still carry with me over 20 years later.

My idea had been to pursue the possibility of building a basketball court/activity center at our church – because I'd been to activities at



other friends' churches and experienced all that a facility like that could afford. I was nervous when it came to be my turn to speak – and after I'd shared my idea the president of the consistory looked directly at me, she smiled, and said, "Well that's a *lovely* idea, but we could never do that... but I *love* your creativity." I was crushed, and over 20 years later I still carry that memory with me every time someone in church has a big idea that simply gets the "impossible" stamp.

As I've reflected on that experience over the years I've come to realize what really crushed me that day wasn't the fact our church wouldn't get a gym. I was crushed because I'd been invited to imagine with church leaders, to put my spirit and energy into thinking about what might be possible, and then as soon as I did there was an "impossible" road block placed directly in front of me – my contribution rendered worthless (or not enough, or not the right kind of contribution, etc.)

This fall I was reminded of my experience with consistory again, but with a positive twist, as I've had conversations with our stewardship team planning the fall pledge drive. Their theme of "Count Me In" is the kind of invitation my heart and spirit responded to over 20 years ago as I went to that consistory meeting, *AND* I think the team has really worked to take the impossible out of the dreaming part of stewardship and pledging. Mostly because this year's stewardship goal is both simple and attainable – but with the potential to have a big impact on our lives together.

This year the stewardship team is doing away with financial goals — you won't hear them saying we need to raise X number of dollars to make this campaign a success. Instead, the goal for this year is to reach 100% in pledging — regardless of amount. Whether you can pledge \$1.00 or \$10,000.00 we simply want your pledge. Whether you're 2 or 102 we simply want you to pledge. Our goal for this year is to invite everyone to count themselves in on the exciting ministry that continues to grow here, regardless of what or how much you have to offer. What I love most about this goal and this theme is that everyone can take part in caring for the stewardship of our church, and everyone can have a meaningful impact on our goal — because we can't reach 100% without everyone, and so every pledge LITERALLY counts! That means the impossible is taken out of the equation — which leaves us all the room we need to dream together.

Update from Your Board of Finance and Property

As we enter the month of October with its reputation for tricks and treats, F&P is finding several tricks while still hopeful for some needed treats. We need to focus our update on the budget for this article.

As we anticipated last month, we have now spent significant time working with all the boards to:

- (1) get a status of our current 2022 budget, which is now 9 months into the year
- (2) formulate a 2023 budget that meets the priorities of our beloved community which was expected to be presented to the Congregation at our November Meeting.

We asked for you to provide any thoughts, ideas, or questions you may have regarding the budget or specific line items. We did hear from 1 person. You can still reach out either through a board you are a part of or directly to F and P. You can reach out to myself, one of our members or send an email to our Board mailbox at FandP@brocktonucc.org.


Currently for 2022 - Our significant fundraising plans are underway. The Yard Sale, Saturday, September 24th successfully raised \$1,000. Your time and talents are still needed to reach the goals set in the 2022 budget voted by the Congregation, this year we are one-third of the way there, only \$13,000 to go. Please Help as much as you are able to make the Fair, November 5th and the Calendar Raffle, tickets will go on sale at the Fair, Successes as well!

There are several large expenses that are due in the last quarter of this year. We are forecasting a deficit that will likely require an additional draw from the invested funds. If true, that will be on the November meeting agenda.

For the 2023 budget, there are line items without good information to make reasonable estimates to issue a balanced budget. F&P would usually be in final budget drafts at this time. We have notified Council that more time is needed. F&P is aware of the Congregation's concerns last year that reports were not provided in a timely manner and we have no intention of repeating that error.

And, on a different subject, if you can help - Media Tech is a sub-committee of our Board. These folks support our Sunday and special service on-line presence. While many are welcoming the return to in-person worship, we are thrilled to share our message and community support to those at a distance when they need us. 




Paint your own Pumpkins!
