*"I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made;"*

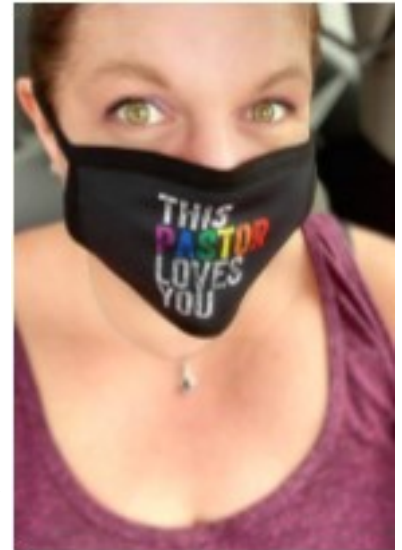
Greetings Ghouls and Goblins!

I would be remiss to pass up the opportunity to talk about masks in this grand collision of the Covid pandemic and Halloween. I absolutely love Halloween and so does Gracie! But, in all fairness, I was conditioned to love it – it is my mom's birthday. I love the costumes and the candy.

I love the creativity it invites and the games that arise. I love to watch kids (of all ages) dress up. They're so excited to pretend to be someone or something else that fascinates them. We see costumes from Disney princesses to Rocky Horror Picture Show; cute animals to gruesome characters. The range is beyond imagination, but nearly all of them have one thing in common; we mask who we really are and what we really look like to embody this fantasy for just one night.

It is an event where we look forward to wearing a mask – even in the wake of a mandate for one for such a long time. But Halloween aside and COVID aside, do you ever feel like you are wearing a mask? Not the masks we wear as part of a costume or that we need to wear to protect one another, but a mask that no one can actually see? These are the masks that we wear 'under the exterior' of our outer beings. Sure, there are goblins, ghosts, witches, jack-o-lanterns out on Halloween, but these are mild in comparison to some of the "masks" that linger long after this exciting holiday comes to a close. All through the year, without detection from the average person, they are worn by the 'silent sufferer' – those of us that are afraid to be our complete, authentic, selves – the beautiful, emotional, strong, tender, loving, fearful creatures that God created each and every one of us to be.

Some of our masks are put in place because we are afraid to let out our feelings. We wear a smile even if our insides ache. We laugh when what we really want to do is cry. We feel to need to portray that we “have it all together,” but in reality, our “all togethers” are falling apart. We are afraid to let people see the real us, the person behind the mask. So....we put on our masks, go about our business, and when friends ask how we are, we reply quickly with automated messages of “I’m fine” or “never better” and immediately redirect to how *they* are doing (or is that just me?). It is a learned technique, a defense mechanism, really. And because so many of us are wearing these masks we look around and think, “gosh, am I the only one?” And it reinforces our mask wearing so that we would never admit to needing help, let alone actually asking for it! The cycle become more and more commonplace sometimes we don’t even remember we are wearing them anymore.

I think this is especially true right now for this growing family right here at Christ Church. In the midst of this holy union of faith communities, we may be tempted to wear a mask to cover up the confusion or the sadness or the pain or the fear that accompanies any major change – even the amazing birth of a new family of faith. It is more important now that ever to be our authentic, amazing, unsure, vibrant, trepidatious, giving, loving, faithful selves as we build this new union. I also know that can be a difficult thing to do. But there is good news my friends! During this time of costumes and masks, we hear the gentle reminder of the Spirit to slowly remove these invisible ones we may be wearing. And you know what? Jesus delights in helping us remove our masks! In doing so He not only helps us see ourselves as we are, but He helps us better see ourselves as God sees us. He knows the emptiness and loneliness caused by a mask-wearer and understands the desire for a façade. But regardless of what we are wearing, God sees through the mask right down to the “real me.” God sees the beloved child that God hand intentionally crafted, and loves us completely and unconditionally.

So, this year, as the fun from Halloween dissipates, let us remember to free ourselves from our own hidden masks and exalt our creator by living exactly who we were beautifully and wonderfully created to be!

**Article V** To hear and act on the proposed Budget from the Finance and Property Committee for the first quarter of 2023 as recommended by the Church Council.



# NOTES FROM MURRAY

## Sacred spaces and the Body of Christ

This year, the world bore witness to the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II.

It was a fascinating event complete with amazing music, rituals, liturgy, and elegance. Much of the world saw this event or parts of it. Later this year, we will also see the first coronation for many decades. I, for one, am curious to see this as it harkens to the past in such a profound way, but not only that. In celebrating the persons who are "commencing," so to speak, they are celebrating and giving thanks to God. Most of rituals performed at the funeral were in direct communication with the Immortal Creator, as they also demonstrated the impact of a mortal sovereign. One thing I noticed, from a church musician point of view, was that during the hymns, EVERYONE sang; even the new king and all those around him. By their posture and body language, they were not only singing, but they were engaged in the act of singing robustly. They pronounced every word with authority and clarity. You could almost read their lips! Westminster Abbey was a glorious backdrop for this event, of course. The beautiful art work and architecture was designed specifically for worship and the amplification of music without the aid of electricity. I am sure listening to the hymns with all of those people singing must have been intoxicating! It is true that the church is the people, but we are also blest with a sacred space that directs our gaze and amplifies our music. The circular window above the altar takes our gaze to the front and outlines the understated, beautifully crafted cross. The choir area is off to the side and, except for the walls that separate the areas, it is acoustically sound. When I entered the build recently, the paraments had just been changed to fall colors. My breath was taken away as the colors both inside and out perfectly complimented each other. This might not seem a very significant detail in relation to worship. Certainly, worship services or worship, in general, can happen even in the humblest of spaces. But when we have it available to us, it helps us to worship in a more profound way. When we have artistry in our midst, it helps us to connect our emotions to the liturgy in an easier way. This emotion, then leads us to losing ourselves in the moment as we are able to delve deeper into the meaning of the liturgy. When we take the Body of Christ, we are participating in a ritual that has been practically untouched for 1800 years. This ritual is designed to focus our minds and hearts to the charity and grace of Christ. This not only helps us connect with the Creator and the Trinity, but also gives us connection to each other. To put it simply, when family eats together, it stays together.

As we approach the Solemnity of Christ on November 20, our last Sunday before the Advent Season, we will be focusing more on our families and close relationships due the upcoming holidays. Our wish is to be filled the love of those around us and also those who communed with us throughout our lives who aren't with us anymore. We will miss many at this time of year, but the sadness of their absence will be buoyed by the memories of their lives and the connections we retain from the memories of them.

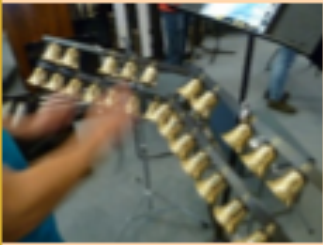

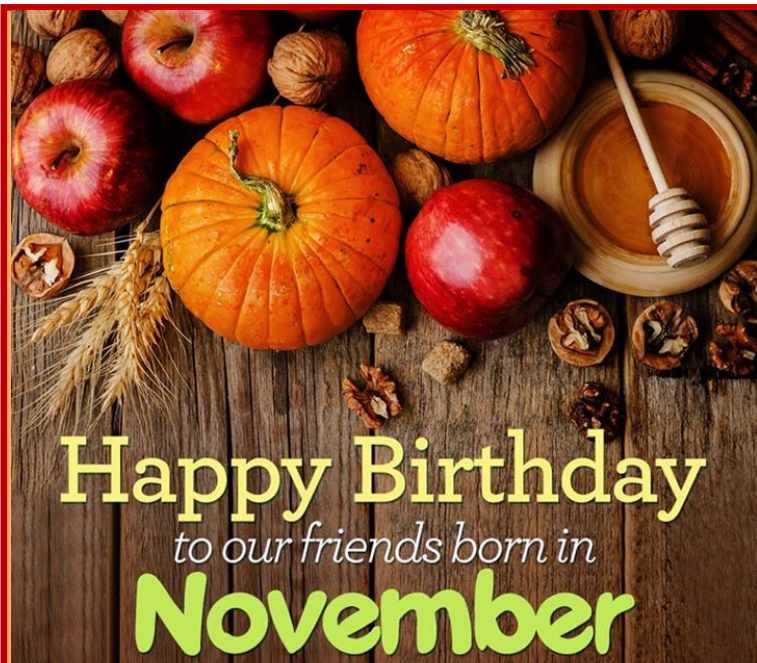

## You'd like to help and sign up for coffee hour but... you're not quite sure what to do.

It's easier than you think! The 1<sup>st</sup>. step is to sign up on the board (on the wall next to the kitchen).

- Arrive about 9:00 am on Sunday morning.



- Start by getting the coffee on. There are instructions for this on the cabinet (near the sink). You put out 3 percolators (regular, decaf & hot water for tea). There is a rolling cart that you can put them on to bring out to the tables in the Fellowship Hall. \*Remember to plug them in before going upstairs.



- Next make the cold drinks. Mix 2 pitchers of lemonade (ratio instructions on sheet and lemonade is in the cabinet to the right of the microwave). Also add water to 2 pitchers and cover all 4 with saran wrap and put in the fridge to get cold. \*Remember the left side is the church's side.

- Start putting non-perishable snacks out. You will find these (and bowls to put them in), in the cabinets to the right of the microwave. \*Feel free to bring/bake special treats to share!



- Put out the extras. You will find plates, napkins, cups & spoons/forks (if needed) in the cabinet under the open window to the Fellowship Hall. You will find all the coffee & items in the cabinet to the left of the sink (creamers, sweeteners, tea bags & stirrers).
- Leave the Sanctuary before the final music. Unplug the percolators and set them on the table. Put out any cold items, such as the drinks and any snacks (yogurt, eggs, etc.). Greet all those happy faces, they'll be glad to see you!
- Clean up! After everyone is finished getting coffee and snacks, you can start to put everything back where you found it. Wash any dishes and put them away. Have Fun!

- 1 zipper (nylon) 12" or longer
- 2 lining rectangles 11" x 9"
- 2 batting rectangles 11" x 9"
- 1 feature fabric 10" x 6" OR 10 -12 strips 2 1/2" x 6'
- 2 strips 2 1/2" x 10" of contrasting fabric
- 1 strip 1 1/2" x 5" to coordinate with zipper
- 1 strip 7/8" x 6" for zipper pull (optional)

There will be machines set up for you to use. You may bring your own machine if you wish. Guild will supply zippers and batting. Carol has zippers in all colors.

December meeting will be our annual cookie swap and we will discuss that at this month's meeting.

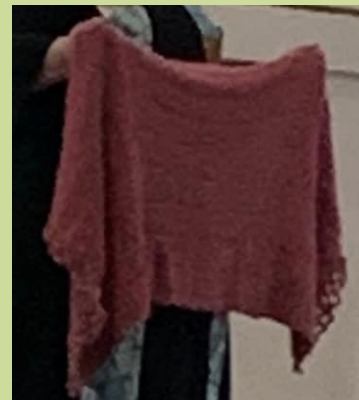
