Much like the original Christmas story, this year's Christmas Pageant will happen without rehearsal! Folks of all ages are invited to grab a costume (or a crown or beard) at the start of worship and join in fun of this congregation-wide retelling of Jesus' birth!





Both the Middler and K-2 classes tried out spiritual practices for Advent this year. The K-2 class made Advent Calendar chains with special activities on each chain and the Middler class made Advent wreaths to take home and light each week with their families. Advent wreath kits are still available for those interested!



Today (the day of this writing) is the day before Thanksgiving. Gratitude is in my heart. I am thankful for you, my church family. I am thankful for the blessings we continue to share in our beloved community. Throughout the life of the church, giving thanks has been documented in works of art, such as paintings, mosaics, sculptures, and music. One particular ritual that shows people bringing their gifts to God is the act of processing. People lined up, carrying their gifts to a central place, like an altar are depicted from the early days of the Church. For example, Ravenna, Italy houses several Byzantine baptistries with processions of varying sizes and with different groups of people; apostles, clergy, shepherds, royalty, and more. The procession is usually begun by the choir singing spiritual songs and raising their voices. The clergy follows, usually carrying a large Bible. The laity does not process but views this ritual from their area in the nave. The leaders of the service (choir/clergy/acolytes) are symbolic of all of us bringing our gifts to God. In short, the clergy does the processing so you don't have to! Coincidentally, we will have a baptism shortly after this gets published. Our baptismal font is octagonal like most - check it out and look at other fonts in other churches. This symbolizes the seven days of the week (creation) and the eighth side refers to the day of Christ's resurrection and eternal life. Curiously, the large, marble baptistry in the narthex is circular another symbolic shape - and has a very interesting plaque on it. Does anyone have information regarding the history of this baptismal font? Please reach out to me, if so. Please pardon my tangent!

Since the pandemic, the practice of processing at most churches, including CCC, has been put on hold due to health considerations. Since we are further along in the process of vaccinations and more is known of the virus, it felt time to bring this ritual back to our service. We began on the Solemnity of Christ Sunday and will continue for the foreseeable future. Why is it important to process, you may ask? We seemed to be doing just fine without it. The short answer is that this symbolizes from the first moments of the service that we bring all of ourselves to the worship, not only our bodies, hearts, and minds, but also our gifts; talents, time, treasure, etc. So far, the hymns sung during the processions have been traditional, but as you will see, there really are no firm boundaries for the type of music we can use. It is the hope that this is an uplifting and pivotal gathering point in our service. The choir is enjoying the resuming of this tradition!

Also, the adult choir would enjoy it if more singers joined in our procession and singing! As we heard this season in several parables, we are asked to give of our time, treasure, and/or TALENT. The choir is a very welcoming place to explore the giving of talent and we welcome anyone and everyone to join in. Especially, but not exclusively, we welcome anyone to join singing with our intrepid Leo Larson in the tenor section!



If you take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from an IRA of the tax-wise **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)** option, which makes this distribution non-taxable. You will simply instruct your IRA administrator to send a contribution from their IRA directly to the church and the contribution counts both toward their annual RMD total and is not considered taxable income to the retiree by the IRS.
