PASTOR'S PAGE

"The real scandal of the gospel is this: humanity's salvation is revealed in the cross of the condemned criminal Jesus, and humanity's salvation is available only through our solidarity with the crucified people in our midst." ~James Cone, The Cross and the Lynching Tree

I remember reading these words for the first time in seminary - which is the first time I'd ever read any theological insight

from James Cone (or any Black theologian to my knowledge). I was 28 when I started seminary, and it took that long for me to be exposed to one of American Christianity's most influential Black theologians. James Cone was an African Methodist Episcopal minister before becoming a professor at Union Theological Seminary in 1969, and in almost 50 years of public theological discourse James Cone wrote some of the most foundational texts in Black Liberation Theology such as: A Black Theology of Liberation, Black Theology & Black Power, God of the Oppressed, Martin & Malcom & America, and The Cross & the Lynching Tree. If you haven't read any of these titles, or if you never heard of James Cone before reading this article, I encourage you to make that a starting point for you during Black History Month 2023.

The truth is that Black History simply IS history – but if even CONTEMPORARY Black voices like James Cone (who only died in 2018) aren't being elevated to a place where everyday lay people in predominantly white churches can be exposed to them we still have a need to emphasize and highlight Black History. Throughout this Black History month I will be committed to preaching and teaching from resources produced by Black theologians and artists. I will be committed to highlighting these voices and experiences during our worship and during my preaching. I will also be committed to learning something new about Black History that I hadn't ever learned before. I invite you all to adopt similar practices during this month - because engaging in racial justice work isn't only about changing the songs we sing or the books we read for one month out of the year, it isn't about putting a new dressing on what's always existed. Racial justice work, and a focus on Black History during the month of February, are about changing and challenging our privileged perspectives so that we CAN have solidarity with the crucified people in our midst.

On February 22, we will begin the season of Lent. We have some exciting services during the month of February, aside from our usual, amazing services. On February 5th, our Intergenerational service will include the Youth Choir singing some wonderful service music. The youth will sing the doxology and a benediction response. They have learned these songs and are proud to present them in the context of a worship service. Later in the month, we will have the Rose Conservatory joining us and singing during the worship service. The more times I see the Rose Conservatory in action within our walls, the more I am impressed. If you missed their concert in December, you missed an incredible display of education and musical experiences that most children don't get access to. We are so fortunate they will be able to join us during our worship service.

One of our featured songs in February will help us to celebrate Black History Month. It is composed by Undine Smith Moore and is titled; I Would Be True. She is considered the "Dean of Black Women Composers". Together, with Alton Trend Johns, she helped to create the Black Music Center at Virginia State College. Through this organization, she helped spread knowledge of "contributions of black people to the music of the United States and the world."



If you have been considering joining the Chancel Choir or handbells, but weren't sure what it would be like, maybe you would like to join for a shorter time span as a trial. If you want, consider joining for the Lenten season (Feb. 22) to see what it is like. It is amazing music and ramps up to a grand finale of Easter on April 9th. The gift of song is one of the most profound we have from God. God, indeed, specifically calls us to sing Psalms and spiritual songs in several scripture passages. Those who join can have a free voice lesson from our wonderful soprano soloist, Alisa. You can use this as a kick start if you used to sing "in an earlier life" as they say. She can help you find your voice again, so you can make a joyful noise that won't be as noisy as you might think. We specifically need tenors and basses to make more friends for our current members in the back row. That said, we will gladly take any voice type!


FROM THE BOARD OF MUSIC

Description Of Boards

Board of Deacons - Responsible for the preparation of the Sacraments; the visitation of newcomers, the sick, the shut-ins, and the members of the congregation; the preparation of the Sanctuary for services of worship; overseeing the church membership rolls, and the promotion of the spiritual life among the members of the congregation.

Board of Finance and Property - Responsible for the financial affairs and property of the church.

Board of Missions - Responsible for the supervision of the Christian outreach and mission programs of the church.

Board of Christian Education - Responsible for planning and overseeing faith formation programs that help people of all ages grow into disciples of Christ.

Board of Music - Responsible for the music program of the church.

Board of Stewardship - Responsible for planning and conducting the annual stewardship drive and will plan and conduct a year-round continuous education and outreach program on stewardship to the members of the church.

Board of Vitality - Responsible for emphasizing fellowship opportunities, church growth, inclusion, greeting and welcoming newcomers to the church and promoting the mission and work of the church to the surrounding communities.

Endowment Trustees - Responsible for all the invested funds of the church and overseeing Rockland Trusts management of said funds. In charge of the planned giving campaign design and execution with stewardship. Steward of the individually named funds to honor donor requests and compliance of the monies being used.
