"...He's been raised from the dead. He's going on ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there." ~Matthew 28:7~

The women in the resurrection account from Matthew have quite a morning. As they approach the tomb they experience an incredible earth quake, see an angel roll the stone away from the front of the tomb (a stone that would have weighed several tons), and then they saw with their own eyes that the tomb was empty. That's when the angel tells



them to head to Galilee where he's gone ahead. So, they do what we as readers of the story would expect them to do – they turn on their heels and basically *RUN* toward Galilee with fear and excitement.

What's unexpected – I'm sure to the women, but also to us as readers – is that the very next thing that happens is Jesus meets them and greets them as they're on their way! As disciples the women have been given a point to go to (Galilee) and they were headed straight there. As readers we're expecting what the context clues tell us will happen – that they'll find Jesus in Galilee instead of the tomb, and if we're being honest that's still a really powerful account of the resurrection.

But Jesus meets them where they are. While they're going where they've been instructed to go as disciples. It seems his only message is a message of encouragement, "Don't be afraid, I'm here with you and I will be where you are going." The subtle message is that Jesus is there no matter where we go — whether we're arriving at our spiritual destinations, or still on our way to them.

I think for this Easter it's important to remember that message – because we so often make resurrection a goal, or a destination when it's really something that happens all along while we're "on the way". We remember and celebrate Jesus' triumph over the grave on Easter Sunday every year, but we also experience it in our worship and lives together week in and week out. As we come to the close of our worship series aimed at trying to cut down on our busyness I encourage you to take this with you as a final lesson, regardless of how busy or how hurried we are in our journeys God is with us reminding us never to be afraid.

Greetings, Beloved Community.






Transgender Day of Visibility March 31

This is a fabric collage piece by Janet Eckstrom. It's made by lots and lots of fabric scraps of various colors and shaped into this amazing fish. Two more to go!




Another wonderful quilt by Janet Eckstrom. A pattern she's been waiting to make. The possibilities are endless.
