PASTOR'S PAGE

"Go into the world and serve God with gladness. Be of good courage, hold fast to that which is good, and render to no one evil for evil – strengthen the fainthearted, support the weak, help the afflicted. Honor all people. Love and serve your God rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit... And as you go from this place may God be in your going, may Christ be in your doing, and may the Spirit be in your learning. Go in peace, friends, to love and serve God and God's people."



I say these words every week to end our worship together, because no worship service can ever really end without a benediction and/or a commissioning. Liturgically speaking a benediction isn't really an ending; because we're called to worship God at all times. I first learned the words of the beginning of this benediction from my mother, as she solidified them as her benediction over the years while I watched her lead worship as a PK (pastor's kid). The second part I learned from my colleague Danielle Neff, who was my senior pastor at my previous call. These words have held deep meaning for me in my own faith life and so I share them with you each week. I appreciate the power and directive nature of the words – they give you something to do or (if we're honest sometimes) something to think about doing – and I always hope that it will plant a seed for you to take and grow throughout the week ahead as we all depart the sanctuary.

Now, as we find ourselves at the start of July I share these words again here in the Courier – because summer is the time when all of us rightfully take some time away from our usual routines to go on vacations and trips; and so I know I may not see some of you very much over the next month or two until programs begin again in September with Rally Day. The same concept of benediction that we carry out of worship each week also applies to our lives on vacation or while we take time away to rest – no matter where you find yourself worship God and love God's people.

My prayer is that this might be a spiritual practice for you this summer, repeatedly asking yourself where you might see God or feel God's presence – and then acknowledging it in some significant (even if it's simple) kind of way. I pray that as you take on such a practice for the summer that you will find yourself being pulled into worship, in all sorts of places, and that the experience would transform you and bring you closer to God. Most of all I pray that you find joy and rest in God, and in those that you love. Have a joyous and blessed summer!

Search Committee Meeting on Open Positions






