#### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

Dear Friends,

According to *The Trevor Project* (<a href="https://www.thetrevorproject.org/survey-2022/">https://www.thetrevorproject.org/survey-2022/</a>) there are some deeply troubling trends among LGBTQ youth in our country. 45% of LGBTQ youth seriously considered attempting suicide



in the past year – nearly 1 in 5 transgender and nonbinary youth attempted suicide and LGBTQ youth of color reported higher rates than their white peers. Fewer than 1 in 3 transgender and nonbinary youth found their home to be gender-affirming. 60% of LGBTQ youth who wanted mental health care in the past year were not able to get it. When we look at the data, for all the gains we have made in our country for the rights of LGBTQ people there is still urgent work that must be done – because people are actually hurting and dying. Places like Florida keep doubling down on making their state unsafe for LGBTQ people, and the politicians leading the charge have support from constituents.

But there's hope – because we are the salt of the earth as Jesus says just a few verses before this, and we can shine the affirming light of Jesus' love like a city on a hill. And if that sounds like "pie in the sky" thinking, the *Trevor Project* survey also bears this out.

LGBTQ youth who felt high social support from their family reported attempting suicide at *less than half the rate* of those who felt low or moderate social support. LGBTQ youth who found their school to be LGBTQ-affirming reported *lower rates of attempting suicide*. LGBTQ youth who live in a community that is accepting of LGBTQ people reported *significantly lower rates of attempting suicide* than those who do not. In every instance creating spaces where LGBTQ people can not only be welcome, but also affirmed and accepted and loved for who they are, there are very *REAL* and *DEEP* positive effects. We are an Open and Affirming church, and have been since 2009. In becoming an ONA church we didn't commit only to creating affirming space in our own building. We committed to doing the same in all of the places we can reach as a congregation.

On June 25<sup>th</sup> I invite you to join us for our special service dedicated to LGBTQ pride. For the rest of the month of June I want to invite you to think about how you can create Open and Affirming spaces outside of our sanctuary and church walls. Think about how you might invite others in our beloved community to join you – and then let your light shine as Jesus has told us.



Spring has SPRUNG!!!! This week, the weather has been absolutely gorgeous! I am in awe of the foliage in our area of the world. We were given a small sprig of evening primrose last year. I planted it in front of our porch. We emerged from winter and noticed that it has quadrupled in size and is about the size of a large end table. It is beautiful and makes us happy to see it among the other shrubs and greenery. I am reminded, constantly, of this lovely anthem by Rutter set to the Cecil (no 'e') Frances Alexander's, All Things Bright and Beautiful. She wrote several poems that have been set to hymns, including another favorite of mine, Once In Royal David's City, that we have sung during Advent every year since I began. We have almost always had a member or two from our youth choir sing the first verse and this has been a special part of the Advent season for me. Back to Spring! All Things Bright and Beautiful is such an appropriate homage to the earth on which we are living for the time being. We see rabbits around our neighborhood and many dogs walk by with their people in the warm air. The lilacs have past their peak, but there are still a few bushes with enough blooms to be able to smell their intoxicating fragrance. The Lord made them all! Not all church choirs can sing this challenging anthem, but we have been blessed to be able to hear our choir sing this in our worship services a few times, including a few weeks ago.

We enrich the larger community through performance, service, and collaboration. The Rose Conservatory uses the most effective ways to achieve youth development goals through intensive investment in the positive social impact of music ensemble creation, rehearsal, public performance and academic assistance.

#### PROGRAMS:

- VIOLIN- Students learn the parts of the instrument and bow as well as proper positioning form. They are introduced to basic rhythms, note reading, and introductory pieces. Upon successful completion of this, students continue with private lessons.
- PIANO- This introduction to piano and music is for students who have little to no
  experience. They learn how to read music, find notes on the piano and other essentials so
  you can begin playing pieces.
   GUITALELE- This instrument is easy is equivalent to an acoustic guitar. Guitars are amazing

  but, acoustic guitars can be big for children. Because this guitalele is smaller, it's real easy to
  hold and handle. Students grasp the essentials needed to begin playing acoustic or electric
  guitar. They learn to play quickly, through a combination of exploring the instrument,
  performance technique, and basic music theory.
- HANDBELLS Learning to play these instruments can fulfill several important functions: development of students' musical skills, encouragement of teamwork, socialization and selfesteem, and expansion of the music program. Students can readily address rhythm, dynamics, key signatures, and notation in a group setting with handbells, and over time explore everything from duration and loudness to timbre, texture, and style.
- VOICE TRAINING- Students explore vocal technique, choral singing tone, sight-reading and performance techniques.
- WEST AFRICAN DRÜMMING ENSEMBLE- This class teaches traditional West African drumming techniques. Students start with a solid foundation of the traditional Dijembe and Dundun drums. Each child learns new rhythms and history of the West African Drum/Culture.




