As we turn the calendar into November, I am drawn to the concept of an attitude of gratitude. When life feels like it is going 100 miles per hour, the piles of laundry grow taller, the to-do list gets longer, and the weekends get shorter, I fall into the trap of focusing on everything that is hard. I find myself complaining about all the things and having no time, my patience grows thin, and I just want to take a nap. This month I am challenging myself to reframe these moments with an attitude of gratitude. Focusing on the little people who make mountains of laundry, the blessing of a home to move into that cause list making, the time spent in fellowship on the weekends with friends is the reframe. Having an attitude of gratitude doesn't take the hard away, but my hope is that it can ease the sting of the hard, even for a short time.



My prayer this month is for families to focus on having attitudes of gratitude. I pray that when tough times come, that they draw closer together and close to this beloved community. I pray with thanksgiving for being able to be in ministry with you and share in the faith formation of our children.


Special Zoom study for Advent: "When God Comes Down"


FELLOWSHIP COFFEE HOUR VOLUNTEERS






We will also be planning our December Cookie Swap party.

Dear Friends,

Mark 12:41-44 is a short passage that's familiar to many who have spent a significant amount of time around church – and it's quite possibly the best passage I could think of to illustrate this year's stewardship campaign of "Count Me In". In the passage Jesus sits and watches as all sorts of folks come to the temple collection box to make their financial offerings, with many rich people putting in large sums of money. Then a poor widow comes forward to put in two copper pieces – the equivalent of one penny as the text tells us. Once he sees this Jesus calls his disciples together and says, "I assure you that this poor widow has put in more than everyone who's been putting money in the treasury." It seems that giving from your heart, according to Jesus, is worth more than the actual dollars and cents of *how much* a person gives.

Last year we introduced a stewardship campaign with the theme "Count Me In" and it was so good we decided to go it again. And it really is as simple as it sounds. Our goal is to reach 100% on pledging throughout the congregation – regardless of the amount pledged. Whether you're able to pledge \$2.00 or \$2,000.00 for the year, whether you're 5 years old or 95 years young – no matter who you are or where you are on life's journey we want to invite you into the exciting ministries that are taking root here in our midst.

What I love most about this pledging goal is that *everyone* can help to have an impact on our goal, because all you have to do is pledge!
