

PASTOR'S PAGE

"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the east to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him."

~Matthew 2:1-2~

Advent is the season of waiting, Christmas is the season of receiving the gift of the Christ Child, and Epiphany is the season of discovery that naturally follows the waiting and the receiving. In some places around the world Christians place as much emphasis, if not more emphasis, on the season *after* Christmas. In many nations through Central and



The text above is often the one associated with the actual day of Epiphany, which is January 6th according to our own Christian tradition. The magi don't arrive until *after* the miracle of Jesus' birth (probably well after his birth) contrary to what most Christmas pageants we've seen in our lives would tell us. They come to him from a great distance at great peril, with great sacrifice, and bearing gifts. They've come to honor him.

And they've done all of this by following a star that inspired them.

If you've been around Christ Congregational Church for the past three years you probably know that star words are coming to worship on January 7th, and if you aren't familiar with star words it's pretty straight forward. Each person in the congregation receives a paper star with a single word written on it. Each one is prayerfully written on the star by me or by Dani, hoping that the Spirit will bring that word to the person who needs it most. Once you've received your star it's up to you on how it might inspire you – maybe it's something you need to tend to more deeply in your own life, or maybe it's something you have to allow yourself to receive from someone else, or perhaps it's a word that will give you the direction you need to deepen your discipleship. It's up to you what the Spirit might say to you through your word. The only stipulation I ever put on it is to *NOT* treat it like just another New Year's resolution. Reflect on the word you receive, think about what it means (both in a practical sense and in a deeper sense) and let it speak to you each day.

Now, I also want to say that everyone approaches the star word practice differently. I tape mine to the door of one of my desk cupboards so that I can see it when I sit to work. I've heard others who put it on a mirror where they get ready each morning, or in their wallet where they'll see it. I've also known others who drop their paper star to the bottom of a purse or deep in a coat pocket, or crinkled up on the floor of a well trafficked kid-mobile. Or still others just lose the paper star and never see it again. That's all OK too! Grace abounds. My prayer each year is simply that the giving of star words might help us to better connect to those magi from so long ago, who followed a single star based on curiosity and inspiration to bear gifts to a new king. We'll all take different paths to get there through 2024, and my greatest prayer is that your path would be Spirit led with God's presence abundantly manifesting by your side. No matter the path, we are all blessed to be able to walk in beloved community with one another so that none of us will be alone.



As the parsonage construction is progressing, a few items will be needed before move-in - are you able to help?


