#### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."



~Matthew 5:14-16~

This is, quite possibly, one of our

tradition's most notable and memorable scripture verses. Even if you don't know it word for word from memory, the idea behind it is one that each Christian has internalized and put away somewhere in our hearts and minds. We are the light of the world.

I got to thinking about this passage as I've received nominations from our church staff for the annual Light of the Word award that's presented each year at our spring congregational meeting. For those who might not be familiar with the award, it was established by the church staff in 1981 and, "It is presented each year to a lay person (or persons) who has displayed outstanding leadership in the life of this faith community." This year's award will be our 44th presented as a church.

While it's always nice to give the award each year to one specific person, or group, I'm always struck by how meaningful the nomination process is too. Every year I've done this with the staff we start with a list of nominees that's incredibly full, and every year we all look at the list and think "Wow, EVERYONE here deserves to be recognized for one reason or another." To me it's always a reminder of just how much light is shining here at Christ Congregational Church.

As we celebrate that with another presentation of the Light of the World award I think it's important to also remember that Jesus said these words to the disciples in Matthew immediately after he'd given them the Beatitudes – a list of folks who will be blessed in God's kin-dom, and why. Jesus' words about being the light of the world speak to the idea that the disciples, and us by extension, are meant to be visible expressions of blessing. We're called to project hope into the world, and in the process we ourselves experience God's hope because things like hope, joy, blessings, and grace have a way of multiplying upon themselves when they're shared among people. And we're working at being a shining light to the world around us.

You are the light of the world, friends - let it shine and amazing things will happen in the world around us.

Applications due May 26th


If you are headed to higher education and a part of our beloved community, you are welcome to apply for the scholarships we have available.

# APRIL FAITH FORMATION







I write music but don't often bring it to completion (that perfectionism thing), but thank you to those who received my performance of at least one piece that I gave the week after Easter, on April 7, as that service's postlude.

It's called "Walk on Tears," about someone speaking to a child. The child in this case is me–a conversation with the kid who still lives inside of me. I believe we all live with those children and the stories they were told and lived.

I come from a family of a great many children–10 kids and

one set of twins: me and my brother. My youngest sister died at 33, not long after the start of the pandemic. Two uncles have died since. Also since the pandemic began I had a failed engagement to a woman in England and was fired from my last position under circumstances that some still feel unjust.

When I sang about dreams that walk on tears, I meant to say that we can go through things and come out better, but they cost us, and the support we give each other is at least as important as the support we offer ourselves, to all the parts of ourselves.

Music has been healing to me-mostly in the making of it, whether writing or playing or singing.

I welcome any to come make it with me and with the choirs here at Christ Congregational.


